Administrative Segregation Report

Section 925: By March 1, the department shall report to the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on corrections, the senate and house fiscal agencies, the legislative corrections ombudsman, and the state budget office on the annual number of prisoners in administrative segregation between October 1, 2020 and September 30, 2021, and the annual number of prisoners in administrative segregation between October 1, 2020 and September 30, 2021 who at any time during the current or prior prison term were diagnosed with serious mental illness or have a developmental disorder and the number of days each of the prisoners with serious mental illness or a developmental disorder have been confined to administrative segregation.

Due to the continued efforts of the Michigan Department of Corrections, 2020-2021 showed a continued decline in the total number of prisoner days spent in administrative segregation. Importantly, while the number of days spent in administrative segregation for all prisoners declined by roughly 7%, the decline for severely mentally ill (SMI) prisoners was more pronounced at 65%. The Department achieved its lowest total and SMI administrative segregation populations in the 14-year history of this report through the continued use of strategies such as SMART units to divert prisoners with mental health and protection concerns from long-term segregation, the development and piloting of new review processes prior to the placement of prisoners into administrative segregation and the safe reduction of administrative segregation capacity.

In comparison to 2007-2008 when this report was first created, the total time spent in administrative segregation by MDOC prisoners has been reduced by over 325,000 days for the most recent year, or a 68% reduction. For the subpopulation of prisoners with severe mental illness or developmental disabilities, total time in segregation during the year has been reduced by 19,000 days compared to 2007-2008, or 95%.

At the direction of Director Washington and in accordance with the Department's strategic plan, a multidisciplinary team has continued to meet throughout 2020-2021 to discuss and develop additional strategies to safely reduce time spent in segregation, improve the environment and operations of these units, and provide staff in these units with the resources and support to ensure their physical and mental wellness.
