

REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE
Pursuant to P.A. 166 of 2022
Section 712(a)
Training Report for Staff with Youthful Offenders

Section 712. From the funds appropriated in part 1, the department shall do all the following:

(a) Ensure that any inmate care and control staff in contact with prisoners less than 18 years of age are adequately trained with regard to the developmental and mental health needs of prisoners less than 18 years of age. By April 1, the department shall report on the training curriculum used and the number and types of staff receiving annual training under that curriculum.

The training modules are an (8) hour program consisting of:

- Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)
- Adolescent Development
- Anger Management
- Behavioral Observation and Recording
- Cultural Awareness
- Effective Communication
- Offender Rights
- Suicide Awareness and Prevention

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) training is 3 hours:

- Describing what PBIS is
- What to look for with the youth inside of a correctional facility
- What incentives are made available for the youth to participate in this program
- Incentives available for staff to participate in this program
