Article 2, Section 414
Goodwill Flip the Script
Annual Report

Sec. 414. (1) Funds appropriated in part 1 for Goodwill Flip the Script shall be distributed to a Michigan-chartered 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation operating in a county with greater than 1,500,000 people for administration and expansion of a program that serves a population of individuals aged 16 to 39. The program shall target those who are entering the criminal justice system for the first or second time and shall assist those individuals through the following program types:

- (a) Alternative sentencing programs in partnership with a local district or circuit court.*
- (b) Educational recovery for special adult populations with high rates of illiteracy.*
- (c) Career development and continuing education for women.*

(2) The program selected shall report by March 30 on program performance measurements, the number of individuals diverted from incarceration, the number of individuals served, and outcomes of participants who complete the program.

This report includes the number of individuals enrolled in the program, the number of individuals served, and outcomes of participants who complete the program from fiscal year 2023 (10/1/22 – 9/30/2023).

- The Number of Individuals Enrolled in the Program After Contact with the Criminal Justice System
 - There were 129 participants who enrolled in the Goodwill Flip the Script Program during FY 2023.
- The Number of Individuals Served
 - During FY 2023, 184 total probationers were served by the Goodwill Flip the Script program.
- The Outcomes of Participants Who Completed Programming
 - Of the 129 enrolled participants, 116 participants (90%) completed programming during the FY 2023 year.
 - Out of the 116 participants who completed:
 - 56 (48.2%) participants are still on active probation supervision
 - 45 (38.7%) participants completed probation successfully
 - 11 (9.4%) participants completed probation unsuccessfully
 - 3 (2.5%) participants are on Active Probation Warrant Status/Incarcerated
 - 1 (.8%) participate is discharged by death
 - 48 had their HSD/HSE at the point of enrollment
 - 35 increase their literacy level
 - 3 received their HSE
 - 66 participated in career development that resulted in employment
