# The MDOC invests in a new and improved record retention building

Walking into work each day, the MDOC records retention staff are met with a maze of boxes piled four high and filled with paper records spanned further than the eye can see. At one point, the record retention building held more than three-quarters of a million records, making record retention overwhelming. It was not until the Record Retention EPIC committee was formed when they advocated for a new retention schedule allowing for some records to be destroyed to make record retention more manageable. The EPIC team worked to update the retention

schedule from keeping offender records indefinitely to maintaining offender records for six years, the medical records for ten years and the education records for five years instead. However, even with the new record retention schedule, the retention building still houses nearly half a million records posing many logistical and organizational struggles.

Currently, the record retention building is dependent on an old access database program to help staff locate records. The current program is slow and could crash at any time. If the program were to crash, the department would have no way of knowing where to locate records. Seeing the need, Director Washington sought out the EPIC committee, which has spent the last two years working on the development of a new records retention system to combat the old clunky system and streamline the records retention process to make it more efficient for all staff throughout the department.

The EPIC committee, led by Deputy Director Jeremy Bush with the help of Deb Bemister and Alanna Schnell, decided to switch to an UltraFile application, moving the records out of cardboard

boxes and into an open shelf system. This means the record retention building would no longer be dependent on a system to tell staff where files are located throughout the building. Instead, each record will be color-coded and side tabbed, so they are easy to identify.

These changes not only help records staff manage files, but it helps all sectors of the department as well. The new record labeling system is now uniform across all facilities in the department which makes locating files easier. Additionally, files can now be scanned with a barcode into the system vs. staff having to manually enter records into the system, saving time and resources. Agents and custody staff will be able to receive requested files and PSI's much quicker now that files can be stored electronically. They no longer have to wait days or weeks for files to be located and then mailed out.

The new record retention building can be found in Jackson in what used to be the old bakery and will house the Central Records Administration, the Court and Writ, and Records Retention Units. This new state-of-the-art facility will feature natural lighting and climate control to help save electricity and cut costs. This \$2.2-million record retention project is expected to be complete in the near future after delays due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

"This is a major accomplishment and the result of a lot of hard work by a lot of dedicated staff," said Director Heidi Washington, "I am thrilled to see it realized."

## NATIONAL CRIME VICTIMS' RIGHTS WEEK

This year marked the 40th anniversary of National Crime Victims' Rights Week, which promotes victims' rights and services. National Crime Victims' Rights week took place April 18-24, 2021 and this year's selected theme - Support Victims. Build Trust. Engage Communities - emphasizing the importance of leveraging community support to help victims of crime.

The Michigan Department of Corrections (MDOC) honored National Crime Victims' Rights Week by encouraging victims of crime to register for the department's Victim Information Notification system.

"The Michigan Department of Corrections recognizes that victims of crime continue to need services long after the offender has been incarcerated. National Crime Victims' Rights Week highlights our continued commitment to supporting victims of crime and their families," said Michigan Department of Corrections Director Heidi Washington. "By registering with the department's Crime Victims Services Unit, victims can stay informed on the status of the offender who committed the crime."

To stay up to date on offender statuses, crime victims are encouraged to register for written notifications from Crime Victim Services. Victims may request notifications by completing an MDOC Crime Victim Notification Request Form available from the Prosecuting Attorney, contacting Crime Victims Services or the MDOC victim services website. Those registered for services through Crime Victim Services must maintain a current address and telephone number to ensure future notifications.

Crime Victims Services offers a variety of additional services for victims including, written notifications, telephone notifications, information on MDOC programs and referrals to local agencies.

Written notifications victims receive include earliest parole eligibility date, transfer of the prisoner to a minimum-security facility, discharge release of the prisoner, notice of a public hearing, escape of the prisoner, notice of a parole board decision, movement to and from Special Alternative Incarceration, prisoner's legal name change, new convictions and parole violations.

# The Extra Mile MDOC staff go beyond the call of duty to help others



In November 2018, Sergeant Steve Mullins who currently works at Central Michigan Correctional was working at Ionia Correctional Facility when he responded to a call to assist with a prisoner who had been found hanging in his cell. Sgt. Mullins and his co-workers worked to cut the prisoner free and began administrating CPR. Additional staff arrived with an AED, but no shock was advised, so CPR resumed and after several cycles, the prisoner began breathing on his own. Healthcare checked his vitals, applied oxygen and a neck brace until EMS arrived and transferred the prisoner to Sparrow Hospital for further medical treatment. Officer Mullins' quick actions and teamwork earned him the department's Lifesaving Award.

In September of 2019, Corrections Officer Lucas Terpstra responded to a prisoner choking. As the inmate began to lose consciousness, Officer Terpstra supported the prisoner's weight and performed abdominal thrusts. Officer Terpstra then guided the prisoner to the floor. The object was dislodged and the prisoner resumed to normal breathing and regained consciousness. Officer Terpstra's quick thinking helped save the prisoners life and prevented any further injuries earning him the department's Lifesaving Award.





When one of Agent Kim Reinert's offenders failed to report, Agent Reinert conducted a home call to re-establish contact. When she was met with no response at the door, she made contact with a neighbor who reported not having seen the offender in over a week. Out of concern for the offender's well-being due to his recent health problems, Agent Reinert contacted Michigan State Police Dispatch for assistance on a well-check. MSP gained entry into the home and the offender was located in an upstairs bedroom. He was unresponsive and had been laying in the same position in bed for several days, he had lost a significant amount of weight and was suffering from severe pneumonia. Thanks to Agent Reinert intervening, the offender survived the situation. We commend Agent Reinert for her quick thinking, saving the offender's life and earning her the department's Lifesaving Award.

#### The Extra Mile continued...

In May 2019, Agent Sara Teske was on duty at the Lenawee County Probation and Parole office in the Lenawee County Circuit Court building when she observed an individual who appeared to be suffering the effects of an overdose. Agent Teske quickly went into action, asking two Lenawee County deputies who were also assessing the individual if they too had determined that he needed assistance. Realizing that the man wasn't breathing, and observing other physical signs, Agent Teske relied on her training and determined the individual was having an overdose. When the deputies advised Agent Teske that they did not have Narcan, nor the training to administer it, she rushed to grab two vials from the probation and parole office and administered both doses according to proper procedure. There was no change after the initial doses, and Agent Teske then had to use additional doses provided by the Lenawee County District Court office. Finally, the individual began to breathe, but was still struggling with the effects of the overdose. Agent Teske prepared to perform CPR, but was relieved by emergency services who had just arrived at the building.



Agent Teske's quick action and correct use of her previous training saved the individual's life earning her the department's Lifesaving Award.



In June 2019 Parnall Correctional Facility Food Service Cook Jennifer Wilson was at the Green Valley campground in Morenci, Michigan when she came upon a girl lying on the ground, not breathing, and without a pulse due to a golf cart accident. After Wilson performed three rounds of CPR, the girl started to breathe on her own. Wilson's quick response and training in CPR earned her the department's Lifesaving Award

In July of 2019, Parnall Correctional Facility Corrections Officer Trent Sisty was on his way to work when he came upon a person in medical distress. He stepped in to administer CPR and kept the person alive by doing so until medical arrived to administer Narcan resulting in resuscitation. Officer Sisty displayed excellent training and dedication while in public by assisting when needed earning him the department's Lifesaving Award.
