A Year To Remember

Join us in taking a look at all our accomplishments of 2022.

With a New Year comes new goals, and we are excited about what 2023 has in store for our Department and look forward to accomplishing many of our goals. We want to reflect on 2022 and its challenges and acknowledge everything

we accomplished together. Below is just a small list of the many tasks our Department and its employees completed in 2022. We thank every one of you for making last year another impactful year for the Department.

- 1. We safely returned to a new normal after experiencing an unprecedented pandemic.** In early 2022, during the Omicron surge, the MDOC developed a Strike team that consisted of volunteers from Correctional Facilities, Central Office, Field Operations Administration and the Department of Health and Human Services to assist correctional facilities across the state with prisoner antigen testing. The work of these individuals helped the Department get ahead and

resulted in us returning to a new normal by mid-2022.

2. We continued our DEI efforts

In 2022 the Department focused on DEI training for all staff and began developing DEI training for our incoming prisoners to our reception and guidance center.

3. We became an MVAA Gold Level employer.

The MDOC is honored to be one of just 19 employers in the state to be recognized as a Gold-Level Veteran-Friendly employer, which is the highest level the MVAA awards. As a Gold-Level Veteran-Friendly employer, the Department now has access to more resources to help attract veteran talent. Resources include nationwide advertising and monthly meetings with other Gold-Level employers to discuss best practices and initiatives and qualify all MDOC employees, their spouses, and children for scholarship opportunities.

4. The Department hired a veterans liaison and developed the Military Advisory Committee to strengthen our relationship with veteran staff.

The Department welcomed Emily Rissman as our Veteran Liaison Specialist in 2022. Emily came from the Michigan Veteran Affairs Agency. The Veteran Liaisons' role is to implement new and veteran-focused initiatives across the Department and support our veteran and active duty military employees by connecting them to relevant resources.

The Military Advisory Committee works to inform policy and topics related to MDOC veterans. It provides input and seeks feedback for ongoing opportunities for veterans and active-duty military within the Department. Additionally, the committee explores opportunities for the reintegration of those returning from active duty and works to determine effective ways to provide ongoing support throughout a veteran's career with the MDOC.

5. We hired nearly 800 corrections officers in 2022.

Facility and recruitment staff continued hosting recruitment events, job fairs and facility open houses across the state. In 2022, facilities held 84 open houses. To increase the number of recruits, the Department added an additional recruit academy just for Women's Huron Valley Correctional Facility recruits and three satellite

academy locations in Marquette, Alger, and Baraga.

6. The Department launched the non-custody new employee training academy. As a result of survey responses from current staff, the Department decided to bring back an in-person training academy for all new non-custody employees. This academy allows new staff to get to know each other, ask questions and become more comfortable in their new roles as they start their career with the Department.

7. We opened the Women's Huron Valley Correctional Facility Vocational Village, the Department's first Vocational Village for women and the third Vocational Village in the state.

The village includes carpentry, cosmetology, truck driving and forklift, robotics and 3D printing, food technology and horticulture.

8. With the help of Governor Whitmer and the Legislature, we saw a historic budget signed into law that invests in our employees.

The Department's executive leadership negotiated with the Legislature and the State Budget Office on behalf of the Department to address the Department's short and long-term needs. Investments in staff include \$42 million for economic adjustments related to increased wages and benefit costs for all employees. It also includes one-time funding of \$2.5 million to improve staff workspaces, particularly staff breakrooms and bathrooms, and half a million dollars to supplement the current officer uniform with a polo shirt, which was piloted at select worksites.

10. The MDOC completed its new Records Retention Building

Hosting a grand opening in August, the new building in Jackson is a state-of-the-art facility with an UltraFile application, natural lighting and climate control.

11. We consolidated the south side of the Gus Harrison Correctional Facility and ceased operations of the Michigan Reformatory.

Due to the declining prisoner population and the high number of correctional officer vacancies among the Ionia prisons, ceasing operations at RMI drastically reduced the need for mandated overtime at the three remaining Ionia facilities.

REENTRY UNITED CONFERENCE

The first-of-its-kind Reentry United Conference was held on Nov. 3 at the Eberhard Center in Grand Rapids. The conference highlighted successful partnerships, programs and services that benefit returning citizens.

The conference featured several breakout sessions and panel discussions on different topics, including services for justice-involved individuals, successful collaboration with MDOC and returning citizens, mentoring programs, reentry grants, trauma and the future of reentry.

The event was a great success, and organizers look forward to hosting similar events in the future.

VETERAN SPOTLIGHT



October 13th marked the 247th Birthday of the U.S. Navy and the Department would like to take a moment to thank all our Navy veterans

and those who are serving in the Navy Reserves for their service

Adam Hollingsworth, Chaplain at Lakeland Correctional Facility, is a Navy veteran who served from 1992-1995. After enlisting he spent eight weeks in boot camp at the Great Lakes Naval Station just outside Chicago as well as completed the Aviation Apprenticeship School there. He was then stationed at NAS Cecil Field in Jacksonville, FL where he was appointed to the aviation ordnance team. His first squadron worked on the S3-Vikings which was an anti-submarine aircraft that also could refuel other aircraft while in flight. In 1994 he was appointed to and went on the first cruise for the USS George Washington CVN 73, a nuclear aircraft carrier. He spent time in the Red Sea during Operation Desert Watch. One day while out at sea they had to fight a fire that had started in the laundry area and worked up the side of the ship and had flames coming over

onto the flight deck. Fortunately, no one was severely injured during this incident. While on board, the USS Washington was selected as the flagship for the 50th anniversary of D-Day when President Clinton came aboard to address the men and women of the USS George Washington.

Not too long after leaving the Navy, Hollingsworth joined the Department in 1998 as a Corrections Officer at Lakeland Correctional Facility. He was a C/O for nearly 17 years. He had the opportunity to work on the public works crew at Camp Branch until the program closed and he covered for the Chaplain while he was on sick leave. He enjoyed the job as Chaplain and when Chaplain Tompkins retired, he took over that position and has been working for the past seven years as the Chaplain at Lakeland.

Hollingsworth truly believes that his military experience gave him the ability to handle himself in some of the stressful situations that working in a prison can bring. It also brought the reassurance that he can handle tasks that he might not have felt that he was equipped for. The training he and his squadron received in the Navy taught them to work together as a team to get all projects accomplished.

Thank you, Chaplain Hollingsworth for your service in the U.S. Navy and these past 24 years with the Department.

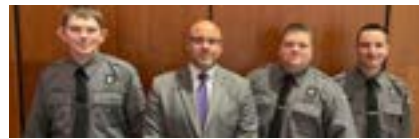

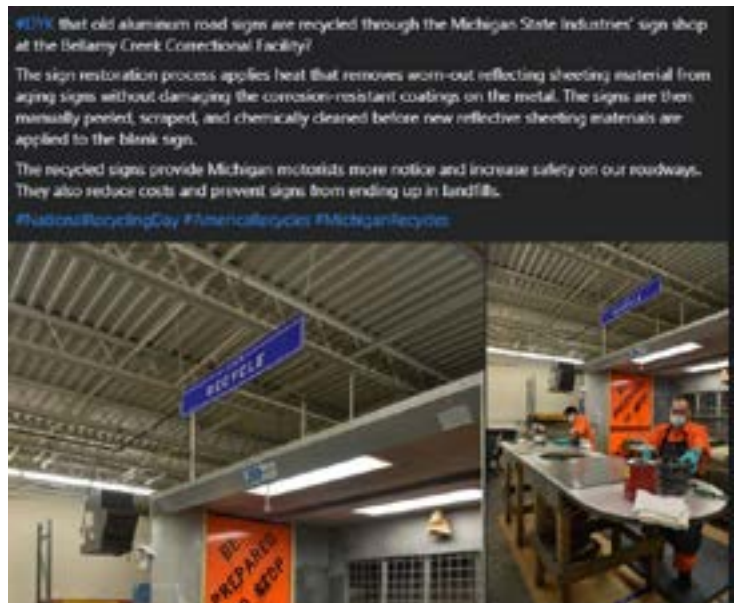
