A Moment in History

Due to the declining prisoner population, the MDOC announced the consolidation of the south side of the Gus Harrison Correctional Facility and that Michigan Reformatory in Ionia will cease operations in November.

In September, the Department announced the consolidation of the south side of the Gus Harrison Correctional Facility in Adrian and that the Michigan Reformatory in Ionia will cease operations in November due to the declining prisoner population. Given the high number of

correctional officer vacancies among the four prisons in Ionia, news about RMI will drastically reduce the need for mandated overtime at the three remaining facilities and those working in the other positions at RMI have the opportunity to continue working in the department.

The consolidation in Adrian is focused on the south side of the facility, previously known as the Parr Highway Correctional Facility. That side of the facility has eight total units, with four that had already been closed due to a declining prisoner population. Ending the remaining operations on this side of the facility will allow those staff to work on the north side of the prison and will eliminate the officer vacancies at ARF.

“While these announcements are normally and understandably difficult on staff, in this instance

we know it may be welcome news to many,” said MDOC Director Heidi Washington. “This will provide much-needed relief to our officers, nurses and other employees who have worked significant overtime shifts over the past few years.”



In Ionia, there are enough officer vacancies among the other three facilities to absorb all of the current officers at the Reformatory. Acting Warden Mike Walczak stated that many officers have already begun the transition to their new worksites in Ionia.

“There have been mixed emotions among staff,” explained Walczak. “Staff aren’t necessarily disappointed, but sad that this chapter is coming to an end. There are also staff excited about the prospect of not having to work overtime.”

The state’s prison population now stands at 32,000, the lowest it has been in more than 30 years. Michigan’s prison population peaked in March 2007 when it stood at 51,554. Michigan’s recidivism rate has dropped from nearly 45% to just 23.6% over the last 20 years, reflecting a significant decrease in the number of violations



and new crimes committed by those on parole. Michigan now ranks in the top five nationally for its recidivism rate.

The MDOC continues to see a historic decline in its prisoner population and has 24 closed housing units around the state.

“This consolidation will not only provide relief to so many of our employees but is a sign of our continued success,” Washington said. “When you couple that with the lowest recidivism rate in state history, we are able to take these significant steps that help our staff, allow us to still provide exceptional public safety and continue to be good stewards of taxpayer resources.”

The Michigan Reformatory originally opened in 1877, following closure in 2001, the facility reopened in November 2007. The prison sits on 40 acres of land with 15.8 acres inside the walls and houses level II and level IV prisoners.

The prison has a lot of history. Originally named the State House of Corrections at Ionia, was renamed to Michigan Reformatory in 1901. Walczak, who returned to RMI in June as Acting Warden, said he hopes the history at RMI is not lost. He explains that the comradery he experienced during his time at RMI was important for his and other staff’s development.

“One thing about the Reformatory is there is a certain level of comradery, mostly because of the physical plant you are very close to one another,” said Walczak.

While the Reformatory is steadily moving staff and prisoners out, Walczak wanted to thank his staff for getting the job done when it needed to get done and he knows they will continue to get the job done and will assimilate wherever they go.

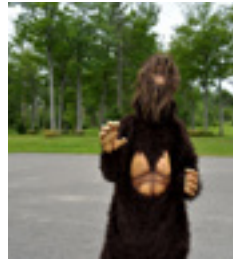
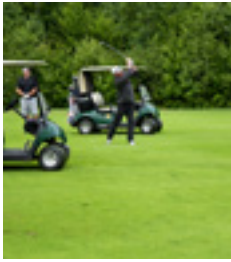
RMI is scheduled to officially close its doors on Nov. 12, 2022.

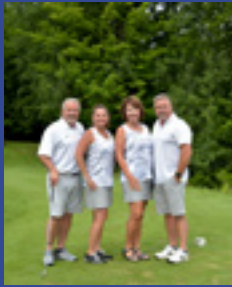

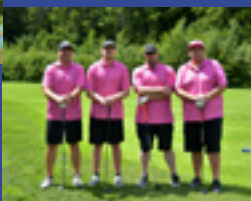


This year's State Employees Charitable Campaign ran from Sept. 5 to October 7. State of Michigan employees were given the

84TH MICHIGAN POLICE PISTOL MATCH



The Michigan Department of Corrections has proudly sponsored Director's Teams in the Michigan Police Pistol Match since

2017. Staff members from CFA and FOA, encompassing virtually the entire state participate in qualifying events to determine who will represent the MDOC as a member of the Director's Team. Additional teams and individuals participate in the event representing the Department of Corrections. The 84th Michigan Police Pistol Match took place on September 15. Eight teams competed in the "AA" Division which is comprised of larger Departments. Director's Team #1 placed second overall, matching our best previous finish which has been duplicated several times. The highlight for the MDOC this year was the individual performance of Chris Ward who shot the highest aggregate score to date for a Director's Team Member. Chris's score of 273 out of a possible 300 was also third highest in the match, down five points from the top shooter.

Chris hired into the Michigan Department of

Corrections in 2016. He left the Department for seven months at the end of 2021 before returning this past May. He participated in his first Michigan Police Pistol Match in 2017 and has been a member of the Director's Team every year since. Chris is an avid shooter and is very comfortable on the line during a competition. Chris was awarded a certificate from Glock for a Glock of his choice for being the Department's top shooter at the event in 2018. Each year the Director in cooperation with Glock presents the top shooter for the MDOC with a certificate for a Glock of their choice. If the shooter has received the certificate within the past five years, the gun is awarded to the next highest score. The MDOC Shooting Team Organization is anxious for the 2023 shooting season. They will be reaching out to the facility worksite chapters to assist with re-establishing themselves and electing a board of directors to represent them. There will be positions open on the MDOC Shooting Team Organization Board as well. Shooting events for the 2023 season will be organized through a cooperative effort of both the worksite chapters and the Shooting Team Organization. There is also a raffle planned for this fall as part of the push to regain some of the momentum which was lost during the COVID pandemic. MDOC Welcomes New Veteran Liaison Specialist

The MDOC is pleased to welcome Emily Rissman as the Veteran Liaison Specialist for the Michigan Department of Corrections. Emily comes to the MDOC from the Michigan Veteran Affairs Agency where she was the agency's first and only community analyst. In this position, she focused on building networks of service providers to support veterans where they live.

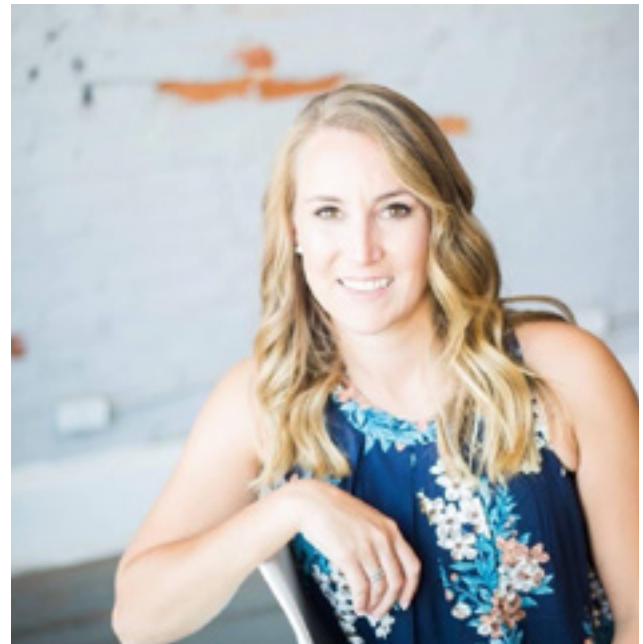
Emily is currently in the Army Reserves, where she has been serving since 2011. She attended Central Michigan University and participated in their ROTC program allowing her to commission into the Military Police Corps. Rissman served in Afghanistan where she was an HHC Company Commander and her unit supported and trained the Afghan National Army on how to do detention operations. Most recently her unit, the 300th Military Police Brigade in Inkster, MI, was deployed to Guantanamo Bay, Cuba to be the brigade element running the detention operations there. She currently serves as the HHC Company Commander for the 300th Military Police Brigade.

Rissman is excited about her new role at the MDOC and believes her experience will help her bring valuable resources to the nearly 1,500 veterans employed at the MDOC.

"I can bring a lot of what I was already doing [at MVAA] to a more focused audience at the MDOC," said Rissman. "I will work to support [staff] to live the best lives that they can with the hopes that they'll take the information that's relevant to any Michigan veteran or any currently serving service member and that they feel informed enough to share this information with them."

Rissman's role as Veteran Liaison is brand new to the department. Which is exciting to Rissman. She works with the Military Advisory Committee, leadership, and veteran staff across the department to implement new veteran-focused initiatives, and support veterans by connecting them to resources that are relevant to them.

Rissman's focus is on developing and executing retention programming and initiatives. "I want to create a variety of mechanisms where [veteran staff] feel they can find answers to questions they may have, explained Rissman. "For anything that's veteran-specific, I want them to know where to find answers or feel empowered and encouraged to



reach out to me directly. I can make that referral so they can get the support that they might need."

Rissman is looking forward to exploring and identifying what the needs are for veterans employed with the MDOC and making sure our veteran staff are taking full advantage of their state and federal VA benefits.

Along with that I'd like to start a program where Millennial Ink removes or covers any Gang related tattoos. Again, thank you for helping be a part of our success.

AMERICAN FLAG ETIQUETTE

How to Display The American Flag

The U.S. flag stands for our nation and the shared history, pride, principles, and commitment of its people. When we properly display this powerful symbol, we signal our respect for everything it represents.

The flag shouldn't be flown in inclement weather unless it's an all-weather flag.

Flags displayed at night should be properly illuminated.

In a time of national mourning, hang the flag at half-mast.

The flag can be flown every day, but it is often flown to show patriotism on these observances:

New Year's Day	Easter Sunday	Constitution Day
Inauguration Day	Armed Forces Day	Columbus Day
Martin Luther King Jr.'s Birthday	Memorial Day	Navy Day
Lincoln's Birthday	Flag Day	Veterans Day

When displaying the flag ...

From your porch, place the union (blue section) at the peak of the staff.

Against a wall or on a window, place the union (blue section) at the top left corner.

On your vehicle, clamp the staff to the right front fender.

With another flag, place the U.S. flag to your left when crossed.

Keep your flag completely dry and folded properly — into a triangle, with the union (blue section) visible — before storing it in a well-ventilated area. If the flag is damaged or worn out, it should be disposed of with dignity.

The flag should not touch anything below it or rest on the ground.

MOURNING THE LOSS OF MDOC ICON LUELLE BURKE



The department is sad to share the news that Luella Burke passed away on Sept. 9 after a three-year battle with cancer. Luella had a 30-year career in corrections and served as Warden for 12 of those years. She served as Warden at both Western

Wayne Correctional Facility and Saginaw Regional Correctional facility where she opened the facility as the first Warden.

Luella was a pioneer for women in corrections, serving as a mentor to women in corrections. She

held numerous positions in the corrections field including President of the North America Association of Wardens and chair of its board; co-chair in 1996 of Women Working in Corrections and Juvenile Justice Conferences in Michigan and Maryland; chairing the Women Working in Corrections Committee for eight years and many others. She was appointed to the Michigan Corrections Officers Training Council by two governors and she served as executive director for the association of Women Executives in Corrections where she received the Susan M. Hunter award in 2008 for her contributions to supporting women working to advance their careers.

Luella's legacy will continue to live on at the MDOC. She will be dearly missed.
