Great Lake Leaf LLC is a family-owned and operated cannabis grow facility with a 4,000 sf building located in Burton, Michigan. Both of the owners have extensive background and experience in the delivery of health care and the goal of Great Lake Leaf is to produce high quality cannabis that meets the needs of the communities in which we live and work.

We will work to promote and encourage participation in the marijuana industry by people from communities that have been disproportionately impacted by marijuana prohibition and enforcement and to positively impact those communities. One of the owners was born and raised in Flint, Michigan and has had many years of experience working on projects that involved the Genesee, Lapeer and Shiawassee Counties (the GLS region). We will focus on this geographic area to implement our social equity plans including the following:

As the company grows and begins to hire employees who are not members of the family we will recruit employees from disproportionately impacted communities located within the GLS region.

We will develop and offer a mentorship program for individuals that reside within the GLS region and who have been disproportionately impacted based upon feedback from community leaders within these communities.

We will pursue partnerships and/or contracts with licensees who qualified for the MRA's social equity program.

We will provide training opportunities for employment in the marijuana industry for selected residents from disproportionately impacted communities located within the GLS region.

On an annual basis, after we become licensed, we will review each of these goals and measure the number of individuals that have been affected by our social equity plans. We will modify these goals and/or add additional goals to increase the positive community benefit that can be measured and provided through the Great Lake Leaf social equity plan.
