Securecann, Inc. d/b/a House of Dank (“H.O.D.”) Traverse City continues to implement a Social Equity plan, to align with Rule 4(16) of the Marijuana Licenses Rule Set (R 420.4(16)) under the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marijuana Act (MRTMA). We are pleased to provide our plan to promote and encourage participation in the cannabis industry by people from communities that have been disproportionately impacted by marijuana prohibition and enforcement. Additionally, we have spearheaded community-specific charitable activities that benefit employees, customers, and our neighborhood.

Cannabis legalization has created business opportunities in an industry that has long been categorized as illicit. Some cannabis business opportunities have barriers and are only accessible to well-capitalized, well-connected entrepreneurs. Social equity programs seek to promote and encourage participation in the cannabis industry by people from communities that have been disproportionately impacted by marijuana prohibition and enforcement. The Michigan social equity program endeavors to thwart the impact of historically unjust policies by providing communities with additional resources and opportunities within the cannabis industry.

H.O.D participates in social equity efforts by employing individuals from disproportionately impacted communities. Across the Mitten State, H.O.D employees about 400 people. In Traverse City, we focus hiring efforts on our neighbors around the retail locations that we operate. We believe hiring employees from the community helps us better connect with and understand the needs of our customers and neighbors.

H.O.D Traverse City focuses hiring efforts on members of communities identified as disproportionately impacted communities by the city of Traverse City and the state of Michigan. We promote community safety by providing overnight security at our location.

H.O.D. partners with vendors and ancillary businesses with licenses who qualify for CRA's social equity program or whom we have identified as disproportionately impacted based on internally established criteria. Some examples of the criteria used to determine disproportionate impacts includes businesses located in disproportionately impacted communities or neighborhoods, business with social equity qualifications.
