## Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing Act Regulatory Assessments for Fiscal Year 2025

The amount of the regulatory assessment for licensed medical marijuana facilities is determined annually as required by <u>Section 603</u> of the Medical Marihuana Facilities Licensing Act and must be paid by those persons approved for licensure by the Cannabis Regulatory Agency prior to issuance or renewal of each state operating license.

Revenue collected from the regulatory assessments is used to fund the programs and services listed in Section 603. The expenditures covered by the regulatory assessments have increased significantly in the last year and are expected to increase next year. Those expenditures can no longer be covered by the current regulatory assessments or existing fund balances.

Section 603 requires that the regulatory assessments be set "at an amount that is estimated to be sufficient to cover the actual costs and support the expenditures" of the programs and services funded by the assessments. After four years of reducing or maintaining the regulatory assessments, the regulatory assessments for Fiscal Year 2025—beginning October 1, 2024, and ending September 30, 2025—are as follows:

| State Operating License Type | Regulatory Assessment<br>(Initial and Renewal) |

| Grower A                     | \$2,500  |
| Grower B                     | \$4,000  |
| Grower C                     | \$15,000                                       |
| Processor                    | \$5,500  |
| Provisioning Center          | \$3,813  |
| Secure Transporter           | \$3,813  |
| Safety Compliance Facility   | No fee   |

Each new license and renewal license issued will pay the regulatory assessment listed above.

To expedite the renewal process, all new licenses issued to existing licensees will be prorated so that the expiration date for all licenses held by a licensee will have the same expiration date as the licensee's initial state operating license.
