Children's Trust Fund Unveils a New Plan to Reinvest All Increases in Tax Check-off Contributions to the Communities of Origin

The Children's Trust Fund (CTF) has announced a new initiative that provides communities throughout Michigan with an opportunity to increase funds for local child abuse prevention efforts. For the next two years, all increases in tax check-off contributions made to CTF will be returned to the Local Child Abuse Prevention Council in the county of origin through the next grant cycle. CTF currently provides local council grants



that exceed the local tax check-off amounts. Under this new plan, CTF will increase those grants—dollar for dollar—with the increases in contributions.

Grants from CTF support a wide range of programs and services through the statewide network of local councils. Based on local priorities, local councils use CTF funding for initiatives such as shaken baby and safe sleep education, parent support, child sexual assault prevention programs, and community-wide education to strengthen families and prevent child abuse and neglect.

CTF is the only statewide, nonprofit organization dedicated to the prevention of child abuse and neglect. CTF does not receive a state appropriation to support its work, but relies substantially on individual giving through the tax check-off, purchase of the specialty license plate, fundraising efforts like the upcoming Signature Auction Event, and interest earnings. Since its creation in 1982, CTF has raised over \$70 million and provided support to over 6 million children and families.

Michigan taxpayers can take advantage of the opportunity to increase prevention funding in their communities by making a tax-deductible contribution when filing the Michigan tax return. When you do your Michigan taxes, look for Michigan Tax Form 4642, which is the Voluntary Contribution Schedule. CTF is listed as "Children's Trust Fund – Preventing Child Abuse in Michigan" along with other charities.

Prevention Awareness Day

We are just two months away from CTF's 6th annual Prevention Awareness Day (PrAD). PrAD is a day to recognize Child Abuse Prevention (CAP) Month and to honor all of the children and families in our state. The event will be held on Tuesday, April 22, 2014 at 11:00 a.m. at the State Capitol steps in Lansing. This year's PrAD will be once more structured as a rally, procession, and the "planting" of a pinwheel garden. The rally will consist of notable speakers and entertainment supporting the belief that child abuse and neglect can be prevented. The subsequent procession will walk down Michigan Avenue toward the traffic circle at Michigan and Washington Avenue, where the pinwheel garden portion of the event will take place. The pinwheel is the nationally-recognized symbol for child abuse and neglect prevention. The theme for this year's CAP Month is once more The Power of One. This statewide initiative asserts that the power of one person, one community, one dollar, and one action can make a significant impact on the prevention of child abuse.

DHS Director Maura Corrigan is a confirmed speaker and pending speaker invitations include Senators Randy Richardville and Gretchen Whitmer. Media will be invited. A Legislative Education Day (LED) component will once more be part of Prevention Awareness Day, which will afford CTF grantees and other child advocates an opportunity to educate legislators about prevention needs and current programming across the state.

CTF invites individuals and/or organizations to participate in this great rally event. Please attend the rally and visibly represent your organization or come to talk with your legislators.

Your participation in Prevention Awareness Day will provide the following opportunities:

- The event will enable you and/or your organization to join with others as a positive presence of support in the belief that child abuse and neglect can and must be prevented.
- Your support reinforces that you take responsibility for championing healthy child development and nurturing environments, key components to the foundation of a thriving society.
- Estimates show that implementing effective policies and strategies to prevent child abuse and neglect can save taxpayers \$124 billion annually.

Statewide April Pinwheel Gardens

Last year approximately 50 CTF local councils planted pinwheel gardens during Child Abuse Prevention (CAP) Month. This year CTF is once more calling upon local councils across the state to participate in the annual planting of a pinwheel garden on April 1, 2013 and throughout the month of April.

The Prevent Child Abuse America (PCA) "Pinwheels for PreventionTM" campaign is an effort to change the way our state and nation think about prevention. It focuses on community activities and public policies that prioritize prevention to make sure child abuse and neglect never occur. It's simple. The actions we take to promote healthy child development are the actions that help to prevent child abuse and neglect, including parent-child interaction, reading, and constructive play. Healthy child development starts a chain of events that follow a child into adulthood, leading to a more educated and productive workforce—which is good for community and economic development. At a time when we all care about the economy, it just makes "cents" to spend more time learning how stable, nurturing relationships influence a child's developing brain and provide a foundation for all future development.

Many local councils are increasingly utilizing the pinwheels in a number of ways, including fundraising opportunities and public awareness events.


