

Child Abuse Prevention (CAP) Month is Only Two Months Away

Even though it is only February and we're at that time of year when; we're either lamenting the coming end to snow sports season, or wishing a warm sun and flowers would appear, Child Abuse Prevention Month will soon be here. Since 1983 April has been designated by presidential decree as Child Abuse Prevention (CAP) Month. During each April, prevention networks throughout our state and nation pause to acknowledge the issues of child maltreatment and to bring awareness to the great prevention work being done to strengthen families so that all of our children may thrive.

For the past 7 years a number of Local Councils have volunteered their valuable time to be part of a sub-committee that helps plan the Children's Trust Fund's CAP Month programming and resources. This dynamic group includes: Catherine Martinez (Bay). Kathy Kelly (Ingham), Holly Naylor (Livingston), Miriana Milo (Oakland Co.), Leigh Moerdyke (Ottawa), Leslie Eschenbacher (Saginaw), and Cindy Swift (Out-Wayne).

First, they assist CTF in developing a CAP Month toolkit which provides a plethora of high quality informational materials that both CTF affiliated and other like-minded individuals and organizations can use to plan their own CAP Month programming and activities. Speaking about Prevention Awareness Day, this year marks the 8th year when we come together during Child Abuse Prevention (CAP) Month to acknowledge the issues of abuse and neglect in Michigan. We also gather to recognize the great prevention work being accomplished in our state as well as to honor all our children and families. This rally event will be held on Tuesday, April 19, 2016 at 11AM at the Lansing State Capitol steps. This year's event will be once more structured as: a rally, procession, and the "planting" of a pinwheel garden. The rally will consist of notable speakers and entertainment. The subsequent procession will walk down Michigan Avenue toward the traffic circle at Michigan and Washington Avenue, where a pinwheel "garden" will be planted. The pinwheel is the nationally recognized symbol for child abuse and neglect prevention. The theme for this year's CAP Month is once more The Power of One. This statewide initiative under the leadership of the CTF asserts that the power of one person, one community, one dollar and one action can make a significant effect on the prevention of child abuse.

A Legislative Education Day (LED) Component will once more be added to Prevention Awareness Day which will afford CTF grantees and other child advocates an opportunity to educate legislators about prevention needs and current programming across the state.

CTF invites individuals and/or organizations to participate in this momentous rally event. Please attend the rally and visibly represent your organization, and/or come to educate legislators. If you receive Facebook notices about Prevention Awareness Day, we request that you share the post (if you are able). We are looking forward to increasing the number of attendees at this auspicious occasion.

Your participation in Prevention Awareness Day will benefit you.

- The event will enable you and/or your organization to join with others as a positive presence of support in the belief that child abuse and neglect can and must be prevented.
- Attending this event reinforces your commitment to championing healthy child development and nurturing environments, key components to the foundation of a thriving society.
- By coming you demonstrate mutual support of each other as Michigan prevention champions.
- Notable speakers will be imparting their experiences and wisdom that day. You might learn something that you didn't know before.

The Michigan Children's Trust Fund Reinvests All Increases in Tax Check-off Contributions to Communities of Origin



Michigan taxpayers can take advantage of the opportunity to increase the child abuse prevention funding in their communities by making a tax deductible contribution when filing the Michigan tax return. When you do your Michigan taxes, look for Michigan Tax Form 4642, which is the Voluntary Contribution Schedule. CTF is listed as "Children's Trust Fund – Preventing Child Abuse in Michigan" along with other charities.

Like last year, all increases in tax check-off contributions made to the Children's Trust Fund will be returned to the communities of origin. The trust fund has always provided community grants that exceed the local tax check off amounts. Now, with this plan, CTF will increase those grants, dollar for dollar, with the increases in contributions.

Grants from the trust fund support a wide range of programs and services through the statewide network of Child Abuse and Neglect Councils. Based on local priorities, local councils use funding for initiatives such as shaken baby prevention and safe sleep education, parent support, child sexual assault prevention and education, welcome baby supports for new families, and community wide education to strengthen families and prevent child abuse and neglect.

Again, please remember CTF when filing your state income taxes. Look for Michigan Tax Form 4642, Voluntary Contribution Schedule, and check to protect.
