Chair Hodges started the meeting by welcoming newest committee member Angela Lugo-Thomas, who introduced herself and said she was honored to serve on the committee.

Members present welcomed Ms. Lugo-Thomas to the committee. Member Denker also stated that this is his last meeting and that he was honored to be part of the organization and part of the community. Chair Hodges acknowledged member Denker by thanking him for his outstanding leadership, professionalism, and commitment to the people of Detroit.

Approval Of Minutes

Chair Hodges called for a motion to approve all outstanding meeting minutes. Member Curis made the motion to approve all outstanding meeting minutes, member Denker supported, and it was approved unanimously. While these items were approved, the approval was not valid as the meeting was not in compliance with the OMA.

Action Item

Resolution 12-2023-03 to Approve the 2024 Proposed Meeting Dates

Chair Hodges called for a motion to approve Resolution 12-2023-03 to approve the 2024 proposed meeting dates. Member Denker made the motion to approve, member Curis supported with the request for discussion. Chair Hodges called for additional discussion. Members decided that they would prefer amending the resolution to state they will hold 12 scheduled monthly meetings as they have done in the past. Chair Hodges asked for a motion to approve amended Resolution 12-2023-03. Member Curis made a motion to approve the amended Resolution, it was supported by member Denker and approved unanimously. While this item was approved, the approval was not valid as the meeting was not in compliance with the OMA.

General Updates

Parks and Recreation Update - Ron Olson, Chief, PRD

Chief Olson began by thanking Bud Denker for his years of service and for everything he has done for the island, and he also welcomed Angela Lugo-Thomas. He said that the next newest committee member has been appointed by the mayor and she will join the committee when she returns

from maternity leave, and Bud's and Michele's replacements are currently being worked on through the process. He continued by giving updates on the boathouse public input process, the Recreation Passport price change, and explained how the Passport dollars are allocated.

Park Update – Thomas Bissett, Karis Floyd, and Gail Fitch gave the following updates:

- They received approximately 1,800 comments and suggestions for the boathouse through the on-line form. The process of compiling the information has begun.
- Thanked Bud for stepping in to help their team and said that they could not have done a lot of projects without Bud and his partnership.
- They are in the process of winter operations. Seasonal Rangers are on layoff and recalled between 2 weeks 3 months.
- Looking to fill a few positions: lead ranger, event ranger and 2 more ranger positions. The full-time janitor position as been filled. They will be fully staffed at the start of the 2024 season.
- They are preparing for winter weather season operations.
- There is a closure for Central Avenue after Portage Way to prevent salt being spread in the flatwoods but will remain open for pedestrian traffic. Signage has been posted.

Infrastructure Updates; Amanda Treadwell, Urban Area Field Planner, DNR

Amanda Treadwell provided infrastructure updates including updates on the handball court, capital projects, hazardous material study, former zoo survey updates, Multimodal Study, and public information process regarding the boathouse (presentation attached).

Law Update –Lt. Todd Szyska

Lt. Szyska said that they are currently on winter staffing shifts, and gave an update on the Stuff the Truck and Sergeant Santa programs.




Shelter #9 – closed to the public for repairs

Belle Isle Aquarium Update

Boiler room roof structural repairs

- Additional structural support required beyond reinforcement initially observed once roof was opened up.
- New tongue and grove has been installed.
- New shingles installed.



Roof is under-supported and needs replacement and reinforcement to stabilize roof.

Wet Mesic Flatwoods Restoration

Contractor wrapping up:

- Construction work to be complete December 2023.
- Pavement markings on Central Ave. complete.
- Vehicular gates to be installed on Central Ave. and Oakway this winter.
- Interpretive signage being finalized.




Gate will be installed on Central Ave. in the Flatwoods.








Figure 39. Respondent preferences of active versus passive recreation.

- Final report will be submitted April 2024.


