
- You must use approved vendors to provide the service.




Sections of trail aligned closely to shoreline will incorporate native vegetation to stabilize shoreline..

# Upcoming Improvements in 2024

### Shelter, restroom facilities, and ADA access improvements for historic facilities

- 20 Shelters & restrooms to be improved \* \$2,015,000
- ADA Access improvements at Aquarium & Conservatory Gardens and Casino \* \$2,700,000

\*Budgets include DNR capital outlay and ARPA funding



Many repairs will be common as those planned for shelter #2, hazardous material remediation, structural repairs and energy efficiency improvements.



# 2023-2024 Timeline for Development Proposals



Belle Isle Boathouse construction estimates for the structure and site repairs are beyond the reach of state tax funded capital outlay budget.

- Dec. 2023: Public information shared; comments requested by end of month.
- Jan. 5: Summary of comments and answered posted online.
- March 29: Five Letters of Intent submitted
- April 12: Three successful applicants notified
- April 23: Applicant site walk through
- July 31: Formal proposals due










#### **DNR LED Enforcement - Citation Breakdown 2023**





### **Public Safety Breakdown**



#### **Department of Natural Resources Conservation Officers**

Fully empowered peace officers of the State of Michigan (MCOLES Certified) enforces all fish and game laws, boating laws, ORV laws, snowmobile laws, state land laws, and all other State laws. Also deputized through the United States Fish and Wildlife Agency to investigate federal fish and game laws within Michigan; statewide jurisdiction.

#### **Michigan State Police**

Fully empowered peace officers of the State of Michigan (MCOLES certified) (enforce all State laws, highway patrol, etc.) Statewide jurisdiction.

#### Michigan State Park Ranger

Not police officers under Michigan Statute (Not MCOLES Certified) requests voluntary compliance with State Park Regulations by authority of the Director of the Department of Natural Resources. Also manages the island wide outreach, maintenance & infrastructure upgrades.






