Meeting minutes

CWAC housekeeping:

18 CWAC members present, 14 needed to pass motions.

Passing of previous minutes:

Dan Villwock, 2nd Chris Hillman, Vote: 19 for, 0 against, motion passes.

DNR Law Enforcement Division updates (Lt. Todd Szyska):

- Retirement impacting numbers of officers, 2021 no officers were able to be hired
- Currently hiring more people, numerous different recruits, and levels of recruits
 - o Using social media as an outreach method
- Able to hire former police officers
- Won't be fully certified until around summertime
- Division is working on filling vacancies
- Waterfowl academy will be happening this year
- Currently down about 25 officers, and will lose more to retirement this year
 - Goal is around 1-3 officers per county, all depends on size of county (2 is target in most counties)
- RAP hotline is being worked on consistently, with people home from COVID the hotline has been far busier than normal

In lieu of Wildlife Division update, Q&A (Barbara Avers):

- Sandhill crane Discussion
 - Presentation at NRC meeting in October 2021
 - NRC or legislators can name cranes as a game species, and then legislation for season dates,
 - Getting approved by USFWS for a season would be relatively easy
 - However, steps have to be followed to get there
 - More cranes are killed under depredation permits in MI, than total cranes shot in other states hunting seasons in Mississippi Flyway
- CWAC interested in developing a letter with MUCC's help to support a hunting season.

Goose population status and 2022-23 regulation framework (Barbara Avers):

- Temperate breeding Canada goose population is growing in Mississippi flyway, harvest is on a downward trend
- Temperate nesting population is growing steeply, subarctic nesting has been relatively stable since late 80's
- In MI, 2021 Canada goose estimate is around 300,000 (from the spring breeding waterfowl survey)
- Canada Goose Framework
 - o 107-day season, Sept. 1 Feb. 15th. 5 bird/ day limit.
- Whitefront and Brant Season Frameworks
 - o 107 days, same as C. goose season dates in each zone and GMU
 - o Daily limit of 5 dark geese only 1 of which can be a brant
- Light Goose Frameworks
 - o 107 days, same as C. goose season dates in each zone and GMU, 20 birds/day

Duck population status and 2022-23 regulation framework (Barbara Avers):

- No data from 2020 & 2021 waterfowl breeding population and habitat survey cancelled.
 State estimates only.
- Drought conditions are getting worse, nesting area quality is down in western prairies
 - However, other breeding areas will sustain waterfowl
- Just over 500,000 estimated wetlands in Michigan
 - Our nesting and wetland quality is doing very well
- MI Breeding Mallard population is just over 300,000
 - Great lakes Mallard populations are looking good
- MI Mallard population estimates are up from 2019, but below long-term average

- MI Wood Duck population estimates relatively stable
- Adaptive Harvest Management process of learning and predicting future population size through models
 - Due to missing data, duck hunting regulations have been adjusted based on model predictions of breeding populations and habitat conditions for 2022
- Duck Packages Liberal, Moderate, Restrictive
- 2022 Duck Framework
 - Liberal (60 days)
 - Duck bag limit 6 total, 4 mallard, 2 hen mallard, 3 wood ducks, 2 redheads, 2/1 scaup (2 for 45 days and 1 for 15 days), 2 black ducks, 2 canvasbacks, 1 pintail
 - o 3 zones, 1 split each
 - Saturday closest to Sept. 24 to Jan. 31
- 2022 Early Teal Frameworks
 - o 16 days within Sept. 1-30, 6 teal daily bag limit
- 2 days designated as "Youth Waterfowl Hunting Days" and 2 days designated as "Veterans and Active Military Personnel Waterfowl Hunting Days" in addition to regular duck seasons.

DNR waterfowl workgroup discussion and options for waterfowl seasons (Barbara Avers):

- 2020-21 Estimated Michigan Duck Harvest 29% Mallard, 15% Wood Ducks, 12% Bufflehead, 7% Long-tailed duck. Total harvest was up, hunters were down.
- In MI, Mallard harvest is on a decline, Wood Duck harvest is slightly increasing
- Statewide Weekly Mallard harvest is highest in week 42 (Oct, usually opener)
- Statewide Weekly Wood Duck harvest is highest in week 42 (Oct. usually opener)
- Sea Duck harvest on the rise. More hunters are targeting them.
- Statewide Weekly BUFF, CANV, COGO, GRSC, LESC, REDH is highest in week 45 (OCT)
- Modeled duck abundance at managed waterfowl hunt areas is an index for migration timing
- ~60% of duck hunters are somewhat or very satisfied with their experience
- ~30% of duck hunters are somewhat or very satisfied with ducks harvested
- ~45% of duck hunters are somewhat or very satisfied with ducks seen
- Satisfaction with 2020 season dates 56% in North Zone, 51% in Middle Zone, 45% in South Zone
- 74% of North Zone hunters, 64% of Middle Zone hunters, and 57% of South Zone hunters agreed that they liked the 2020 season dates
- 43% of North Zone hunters, 52% of Middle Zone hunters, and 57% of South Zone hunters agreed that they preferred a later end to the season.
- 2020 hunters satisfied with goose season dates, overall experience, and geese seen. Satisfaction of geese harvested lower.

CWAC recommendations for waterfowl seasons:

- Sept. Teal Season:
 - o **Motion**: for Option 1, keep season as it was in 2020 (King), 2nd (Borske).
 - o September 1-16, 2022
 - Some discussion about Sept. 3rd opener
 - o **Vote**: 16 for, 2 against, motion passes
- Youth Hunt and Veterans/ Active Military:
 - o **Motion**: for Option 1 (King). 2nd (Godi).
 - o September 17-18, 2022. 3rd weekend in Sept.
 - Discussion about need for concurrence of Veterans hunt with Youth hunt, comment about hunting ducks for 18 straight days of September (w/ teal season)
 - o **Vote**: 18 for, 0 against, motion passes.
- 3 Year Season Openers
 - o **Motion**: to approve revised Option 3 (Allaire), 2nd (Villwock)
 - o North Zone:
 - 2022 = Sept. 24
 - 2023 = Sept. 30
 - 2024 = Sept. 28
 - Middle Zone:
 - 2022 = Oct. 8
 - 2023 = Oct. 7
 - 2024 = Oct. 5
 - o South Zone:
 - 2022 = Oct. 15
 - 2023 = Oct. 14
 - 2024 = Oct. 12
 - Discussion:
 - Sets Middle Zone back to "normal" South Zone opener in 2022 after 1st year
 of zone boundary change. Some concern that Saginaw Bay now dictating the
 opener for whole Middle Zone.
 - There will be 2 weeks between North and Middle Zone openers in 2022
 - Vote: 17 for, 1 against, motion passes.
- Duck North Zone:
 - o **Motion** for Sept. 24- Nov. 20; Nov. 26-27 (Kristelis), 2nd (Bellingar).
 - o **Vote**: 18 for, 0 against, motion passes.
- Duck Middle Zone:
 - o **Motion** for Oct. 8 Dec. 4 and Dec. 17-18 (Godi) 2nd (Cleary).
 - Discussion about season opening date being similar to south zone prior to zone boundary change that moved Saginaw Bay into Middle Zone
 - o **Vote**: 17 for, 1 against, motion passes

- Duck South Zone:
 - o **Motion** for Oct. 15 Dec. 11 and Dec. 31 Jan. 1 (Zoli) 2nd (Dabrowski).
 - Discussion about dates of split dates. Maybe a longer split, maybe in November to provide more days in December
 - o **Vote**: 15 for, 3 against, motion passes
- Duck Bag Limit:
 - Motion to have maximum allowed under federal framework (Villwock) 2nd (Quist). Daily bag of 6 ducks only 4 mallards (2 can be hens), 3 wood ducks, 2 redheads, 2/1 scaup, 2 black ducks, 2 canvasbacks, 1 pintail. Scaup Season: 45 days with 2 birds per day first, then 15 days with 1 bird per day in North Zone; 15 days with 1 bird and 45 days with 2 birds in Middle and South Zones.
 - Vote: 18 for, 0 against, motion passes.
- Goose North Zone:
 - o **Motion** for Sept. 1- Dec. 16 (Bellinger), 2nd (Kritselis).
 - Vote: 18 for, 0 against, motion passes.
- Goose Middle Zone:
 - Motion for Sept. 1 30, Oct. 8 Dec. 23 (Dabrowski) 2nd (Retherford).
 - o **Vote**: 18 for, 0 against, motion passes
- Goose South Zone:
 - Motion for Sept. 1 30, Oct. 15 Dec. 11, Dec. 31 Jan. 8, and Feb. 4 13 (Quist) 2nd (Villwock).
 - o Discussion about splits and if more days are desired in January or February
 - Vote: 17 for, 1 against, motion passes
- Allegan GMU:
 - Motion for workgroup Option 1: Sept. 1-30; Nov. 5-13; Nov. 26-Dec. 4; Dec. 17-Jan. 13 (Villwock) 2nd (Hillman).
 - o **Vote**: 18 for, 0 against, motion passes
- Muskegon GMU:
 - o **Motion** for workgroup Option 1: Oct. 15-Dec. 22 (Quist) 2nd (Villwock).
 - Vote: 18 for, 0 against, motion passes
- Other Geese Bag Limits:
 - o **Motion** to adopt the workgroup option below: (Villwock) 2nd (Cleary)
 - Snow and Ross (light geese):
 - Same as Canada goose season dates in each zone and GMU
 - 20 daily limit
 - Dark geese (brant, white-fronted, C. geese):
 - Same as Canada goose season dates in each zone and GMU
 - Daily limit for dark geese is 5 with only 1 brant
 - o **Vote**: 18 for, 0 against, motion passes
- NRC meeting for information on February 10, 2022, at MSU Veterinary Diagnostic Lab to represent CWAC: Stathi Kritselis will represent CWAC

- o March 10, 2022, for action
- Next CWAC meeting:
 - Motion to have next CWAC meeting January 14th, 2023 (King) 2nd (Kritselis), Vote: 17 for, 1 against, motion passes

Great Lakes mallard research project (Ben Luukkonen, MSU graduate student):

- Several partners involved.
- Partners in WI, IL, IN, and OH
- 194 transmitters deployed in 2021, few in spring, most during summer.
- Most in Michigan and Wisconsin
- Some mortalities already 33 due to predation, 26 unknown (assumed dead or couldn't find duck or transmitter), 22 from hunting, 1 poaching.
- Over 800,000 data points already.
- Goal to deploy about 200 more transmitters in 2022, and more in 2023, continue data collection, and work on formal analysis
- Only 2 birds have left the flyway and went to Atlantic flyway

Managed waterfowl area work group update (Jeremiah Heise):

- Working to address and identify issues in hunting operations and habitat management for long- and short-term success year round
- Goal is to create a 10-year plan for both hunting operations and habitat management
- Will be several points for stakeholder input
