### Amendment to FO 200.23 – Inland Rivers and Streams - Trout and Salmon Regulations

I MOVE TO AMEND FISHERIES ORDER 200.23 TO ADD “WITH THREAD” TO THE DEFINITION OF ARTIFICIAL FLIES. IN ADDITION, I PROPOSE MINOR EDITS TO THE SENTENCE STRUCTURE OF THE DEFINITION TO ADD CLARITY.

- 4) “Artificial flies”, known as wet and dry flies, streamers or nymphs, is defined as a single pointed hook, or no more than two single pointed hooks connected in-line (the second hook commonly known as a stinger hook), crafted with natural, artificial and/or synthetic materials attached to the hook **with thread**. An artificial fly may not include a spinner, spoon, scoop, lip or any other fishing lure or bait attached. Material of any type cannot be attached above the eye of the hook. ~~except that~~ The fly or leader may be weighted, but no weight shall be attached to the terminal tackle in a manner that allows the weight to be suspended from or below the hook. Single pointed hooks are restricted to measuring ½ inch or less from point to shank.
