



- Management Purpose: These properties are significant inholdings within the forest and their acquisition will consolidate forest boundary and enable broader resource management within the Forest Management Unit.
- Comments: Tract A possesses approximately 1,550 feet of shoreline along Lake Superior's High Rock Bay. The shoreline is level but rocky with large boulders and cobbles. The property is relatively level and gently slopes from west to east. The forest cover is comprised of lowland conifer, mixed hardwood, and scattered aspen.
- Tract B is interior land relatively level with little variation. The forest cover is comprised of lowland conifer, mixed hardwood, and scattered aspen. The property has not been harvested in many years.
- Tract C possesses approximately 3,500 feet of shoreline along Lake Superior. The shoreline is level but rocky with large boulders and cobble. The remote area at the tip of the Keweenaw Peninsula is difficult to access but offers scenic views of both sunrise and sunset. The forest cover is comprised of mature mixed conifer, hardwood, and scattered aspen.
- This set of purchases serve to consolidate state forest land management, obtain better access through uplands, and secure significant stretches of Lake Superior shoreline.
- In support of the Department's mission, the seller was able to act quickly to purchase these three high conservation value parcels and has offered them to the Department.
- Minerals: Mineral rights on all three tracts are held by a third party.
- Recommendation:
  1. That the acquisitions be approved, with payment to be made from the Land Exchange Facilitation Fund.
  2. That this land be dedicated as part of the Baraga Forest Management Unit.
  3. That the Keweenaw Community Forest Company's efforts in this partnership are recognized and appreciated.

- Comments: The DNR and Ducks Unlimited are partnering on a break-through wetland restoration demonstration project in the western Lake Erie basin. This tract is 94.94 acres containing a mixture of active farmland, county drains, and forest. The second of a planned series of land transfers from Ducks Unlimited to the DNR, this property represents several years of dedicated collaboration between the DNR, MDARD, EGLE, and Ducks Unlimited to purchase restorable farmland to reduce nutrient and sediment loading into Lake Erie. This project is funded through the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund, Great Lakes Restoration Initiative with US EPA, and the American Rescue Plan Act with DNR. The final project will be a brand new, nearly 400-acre State Game Area containing a newly restored wetland complex. The wetland is currently in the survey and design phase and construction is expected to occur in 2025.
