

- 2x received letter with information to access survey online and a paper copy of the survey to mail back




#### **HUNTER/TRAPPER WEB SURVEY**






## Which of the following types of outdoor recreation activities do you typical do in Michigan? (general population)




### Which of the following best describes your personal experiences with wolves in Michigan?




### ...how do you think the wolf population has changed in Michigan during the past five years?




## ...how would you like the wolf population to change in Michigan during the next five years?




### How acceptable are each of the following wolf population scenarios to you?






#### Response by People to Perceived Risks from Human-Wildlife Interactions




## General public acceptability for wolf management given various scenarios related to wolf behavior




# If a wolf or wolves had to be removed from an area for some reason, how acceptable are the following possible methods to you personally?




