



**State of Michigan  
Metallic Minerals Lease Application  
Virtual Public Meeting**

Talon Michigan LLC, of Tamarack, Minnesota, has requested direct, metallic mineral leases from the State of Michigan covering Department of Natural Resources metallic mineral rights located within Covington Township and Spurr Township, Baraga County; Duncan Township, Houghton County; Bates Township, Crystal Falls Township, Hematite Township, and Iron River Township, Iron County; and Michigamme Township and Republic Township, Marquette County, Michigan, containing 23,288.40 net acres, more or less. If approved by DNR, a lease to Talon Michigan LLC, would grant the exclusive right to explore for the presence of metallic minerals in the described areas. A lease alone does not grant a lessee a right to mine.
