What is geocaching?

Often described as an outdoor treasure hunt, geocaching combines the outdoors and modern technology. Armed with clues and a GPS-enabled device, participants utilize GPS to find cleverly hidden caches (or containers). Visit Geocaching.com for more information.

How the GeoTours work

Visit Geocaching.com to sign in or sign up for a free basic account. Search for the MSPGT GeoTour by GT number.

Download and print this logbook (8.5x11).

Get outdoors and find as many GeoTour caches as you can! Sign the logbook that can be found in each cache and return it to the cache.

Record the code words found in each cache in the appropriate line on this form.

Log your finds on Geocaching.com, adding your story and photos if you want.

There are two ways to order your coin:

1. Visit mi-geocaching.org and click on the GeoTour reward page and follow prompts.
2. Mail your 'logbook' to Michigan Geocaching Organization, P.O. Box 160, Eastpointe, MI 48021. You will be mailed an invoice.

Rewards are limited and will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis, while supplies last.

Available rewards

A (really cool!) geocoin!

Geocoins are for sale for those participating in the GeoTour AND for those that wish to support the GeoTour.

Geocoins for cachers: Each coin has a base and four inserts. One insert comes with the base and the three others are earned by completing different editions of the GeoTour. An insert is earned when a minimum of 13 of the 15 GeoTour specific geocaches have been found.

Coins for supporters: Coins sold to supporters have no inserts. They are ONLY the base coin.

Fun, digital souvenirs!

Find and log all geocaches in each region and you will receive a digital souvenir for that region. Find all 45 and you will receive an overall digital souvenir from Geocaching.com.

All geocache logs must be physically signed by the seeker and finds must be logged on Geocaching.com to qualify. Entries must be accompanied by this completed passport. There is a limit of one reward per geocaching account per tour.
