CLINICAL AND NON-CLINICAL TEEN HEALTH CENTER REPORT - JANUARY 1, 2002 - DECEMBER 31, 2002**

**BACKGROUND:**

This report summarizes the activities and funding sources of the 22 clinical teen health centers which received teen health center funding in calendar year (CY) 2002. Eighteen of the teen health centers are school-based and four are community-based health centers in locations easily accessible to teens. The clinical teen health center model provides on-site primary health care, psycho-social services, health promotion/disease prevention education, and referral services to youth 10-21 years of age.

This report also summarizes data based on services provided by the 9 non-clinical teen health centers (formerly referred to as alternative model sites). These non-clinical centers do not deliver on-site primary care services but do provide health services based on the needs of teens in their local jurisdiction. They deliver a variety of services, including individual health screening, case finding and referral, as well as health education and risk reduction information.

**\*2002 HIGHLIGHTS:**

Key highlights noted in review of the calendar year 2002 data are as follows:

- The total number of teens receiving services through the 22 clinical health centers was 16,623.
- The total number of all health services provided to teens in clinical centers was 58,986.
- Clinical teen health centers provided over 7,000 immunizations and 32,288 general medical services to at-risk youth in Michigan.
- Approximately 63% of services were provided to youth of color during 2002. Forty-eight percent of youth that received services in the clinical teen health centers were African-American.
- Males comprised approximately 45% of the total users.
- Teens under 15 years of age represented approximately 55% of all users, with 9,134 teens under 15 receiving services.
- Approximately 37,214 teens received health information and education in 2,738 sessions conducted by clinical teen health center staff.
- The nine non-clinical teen health center sites provided a total of 3,217 educational sessions reaching 44,835 teens. The non-clinical health sites also provided 20,097 services and 3,030 referrals to youth in CY 2002.

**\*Program numbers dropped in CY 2002 due to Executive Order Budget Cuts issued in November, 2001 that eliminated funding for the program. Funding was fully restored in February, 2002 but four clinical teen health centers had already closed and all nine non-clinical teen health centers had stopped programming. Three of the four clinical teen health centers reopened in July, 2002.**




# Teen Health Center Services

January 1, 2002 through December 31, 2002




# Teen Health Center Referrals

Definitions of Service and Referral Categories**

The following definitions of the service/referral categories are meant to be all encompassing and mutually exclusive and should apply to all services provided or referrals made. Individual or small group education may include groups of up to ten persons for specific education, treatment, or therapy. Small groups are recorded here only when persons have been diagnosed, referred for follow-up, and are being individually charted and reported for this service.

- (a) Chronic Disease Management is the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and maintenance of chronic conditions such as hypertension, diabetes, sickle cell anemia, scoliosis, asthma, cystic fibrosis, irreversible heart murmur, allergies, and irreversible skin anomalies. (Diet instruction related to and part of treatment for chronic conditions/diseases should be included here.)
- (b) Family Planning\* are those medical, nursing, social, and educational activities which enable individuals to exercise informed choice in fulfilling their personal childbearing objectives.
- (c) Health Promotion and Risk Reduction are activities undertaken for the purpose of reducing risks including health risk appraisals, behavior modification, and education programs for smoking cessation, proper exercise, stress management, and accident prevention. (Healthful diet instruction for risk reduction purposes should be included here, including weight management and weight loss if not related to a chronic or acute condition.)
- (d) Immunization services entails the assessment and provision of appropriate vaccines for age.
- (e) Mental Health Services and Counseling encompasses services designed to facilitate the best possible psychological and emotional well-being of adolescents.
- (f) Prenatal and Postpartum Care includes those medical, nursing, social, and education services provided to pregnant and postpartum adolescents, including prepared childbirth/expectant parent classes and diet instruction.
- (g) STD Diagnosis and Treatment encompasses those medical, nursing, social, and educational services for adolescents tested for, having or suspected of having a sexually transmitted disease.
- (h) Substance Abuse Diagnosis and Treatment includes diagnosis, counseling, detoxification, custodial care, supportive and ancillary services for rehabilitation and follow-up counseling after discharge from a program.
- (i) General Medical encompasses those services provided which do not fall into the other nine categories such as diagnosis and treatment of minor, acute illness and injuries, comprehensive physical examinations, EPSDT, gynecological examinations, and well-child services.

*\*State law prohibits prescribing, dispensing or distributing contraceptives on school property. If a family planning service is reported by a school-based teen health center, it refers to either an examination or follow-up visit.*

## DEFINITIONS OF EDUCATIONAL PRESENTATION CATEGORIES

The following definitions have been used to describe all large group/class educational sessions provided.

- (a) Chronic Disease Education includes information regarding prevention, symptom recognition, and management of chronic conditions such as hypertension, diabetes, sickle cell anemia, scoliosis, asthma, cystic fibrosis, irreversible heart murmur, allergies, and irreversible skin anomalies.
- (b) Family Planning/Reproductive Health Education includes information regarding sexuality development and family planning which enables individuals to exercise choice in fulfilling personal childbearing objectives.\*
- (c) Health Promotion and Risk Reduction Education includes information on reducing risks of health problems and developing healthy behaviors which limit the incidence of disease and injuries. It may also include information on adolescent health resources and utilization of health systems.
- (d) Immunization Education includes information on the importance of receiving primary immunization and maintaining a positive immunization status.
- (e) Mental Health Education includes topics designed to facilitate the best possible psychological and emotional well-being of adolescents. Examples include general information on development of positive self-esteem, stress/anger management, suicide prevention, family and peer interactions.
- (f) Prenatal and Postpartum Care Education includes information provided to pregnant and postpartum adolescents.
- (g) STD and HIV Prevention Education includes information regarding the prevention and management of sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV and AIDS.
- (h) Substance Abuse Prevention Education includes information about drug abuse prevention, treatment, and counseling.
- (i) General Medical Education includes information regarding a variety of diseases and injuries which do not logically fall into other listed categories.

\* Sessions provided in schools require compliance with the School Code Sections 1506 and 1507.
