How do I qualify?

The requirements for living at the Pine Lake Family Center are few:

- You must be a parent or married couple
- You must be enrolled in an MCTI training program
- Your children must be eighteen months of age or older to attend the day care center

You will be asked to complete a Pine Lake Family Center admissions packet. Also, your children will need to have a physical examination and required immunizations to attend school or day care.

What are the living units like?

Each unit is nicely furnished with a sofa, chairs, end tables, lamps, dining furniture, beds, dressers, desktops and desk chairs, stove, refrigerator, microwave oven, and shower curtain. You will also have access to a washer and dryer in your building. You will need to provide your own bedding and other linens, kitchen utensils, and personal items.

All of the units at the Pine Lake Family Center are wheelchair accessible, smoke free, and equipped with smoke alarms and fire extinguishers.

Tell me about the day care center

Delightfully decorated to appeal to children, the day care center is part of the Pine Lake Family Center complex. It can serve up to 32 children between the ages of eighteen months and twelve. An outside playground adds to the many activities offered inside. The day care center is fully licensed by the state of Michigan.

Who operates the center?

The center is owned and operated on behalf of the Michigan Career & Technical Institute by the Pine Lake Fund. The Fund is a nonprofit organization that promotes the training and placement of persons with disabilities attending MCTI.

What does it cost to live at the Pine Lake Family Center?

The cost of living at the Pine Lake Family Center depends on each applicant's financial circumstances. For Family Independence Agency (FIA)-eligible students, the housing reimbursement is \$310 a month for a two-bedroom unit and \$360 a month for a three-bedroom unit. This cost includes utilities and local phone. The day care reimbursement is \$2.25 an hour.

For students who do not meet low-income guidelines, costs are \$450 a month for a two-bedroom unit and \$550 a month for a three-bedroom unit. Day care cost is \$3 an hour for private pay students.
