


LET'S TALK NUMBERS

SUCCESS STORIES

- Student arrested and gun confiscated after OK2SAY tip alerted law enforcement.
- Fight averted after OK2SAY tip alerted school personnel.
- Bullied student thinking about suicide received mental health assistance and help from school.

PURPOSE

OK2SAY encourages confidential tips on potential harm or criminal activities directed at students, school employees, and schools.

TIPS ARE CONFIDENTIAL

A Secret Service study found that in 81% of violent schools incidents, someone other than the attacker had knowledge of the plan, but failed to report it because of fear of retaliation, or being labeled a snitch.

To eliminate that fear and help break the code of silence, OK2SAY tips and the tipster's identity are confidential.



Over 500 OK2SAY tips were filed within the first five months.



WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

Specially trained operators screen and forward tips to local law enforcement, schools, community mental health organizations and local DHS offices. Some tips require additional investigation and intervention, while others are informational in nature. Upon receipt of a tip, the local organization has the ability to address the issue and respond accordingly.

Each responding organization is asked to complete an Outcome Report detailing the nature of the tip, how the tip was handled, and whether or not the situation was resolved or requires ongoing attention. The Outcome Report provides local entities an opportunity to illustrate that student safety threats are tracked and taken seriously.

The Outcome Report is easy to complete by using the drop down menu on the OK2SAY website.
