

MI School Data Inactive User Accounts

Effective October 1, 2019, all MI School Data user accounts that have not accessed the system in the previous 18 months will be inactivated. Questions related to logins and password reset can be directed to your <u>ISD/RESA technical contact</u>.

What are School Services & Offerings in the MI School Data Portal?

As a new school year begins, it is time for your district's Educational Entity Master (EEM) authorized user to update leadership changes at your buildings and districts. Another important area to update is the School Services & Offerings feature in the MI School Data portal which allows schools to highlight programs and services that set them apart from other schools. **The next window to submit changes to CEPI is Monday, December 2, 2019.** For the School Services & Offerings feature, once you search for a school, district, etc., from the <u>Parent Dashboard</u>, the pull down



menu to the right will appear. Please review the submission <u>instructions</u> provided by CEPI or contact the Help Desk at cepi@michigan.gov.

MI School Data Public Releases for August 2019 (2018-19 data files)

<u>Child Count</u>: Counts and percentages of early childhood participants have been updated. Childcare Subsidy data has been added to the programs available for selection. This program offers payment assistance to parents in certain <u>eligibility subgroups</u> who need childcare for reasons such as pursuing high school completion or unavailability due to employment. An unduplicated count option has also been added to the All Programs category.

<u>English Learner Assessment</u>: This report shows how students performed on the WIDA ACCESS assessment for ELs. This annual secure large-scale English language proficiency assessment is given to kindergarten through 12th grade students who were identified as English learners.

<u>Grades 3-8 Assessments, High School Assessments and College Readiness</u>: These reports will include recent M-STEP and SAT data. PSAT data will also be added to Grades 3-8 Assessments beginning with this school year, showing performance levels, scaled scores and proficiency data for 8th grade English and mathematics. **Public release: Wednesday, August 28, 2019.**

<u>Kindergarten Count</u>: This report shows the order in which students were enrolled in publicly funded early childhood education programs, such as Early On[®], Early Childhood Special Education, Great Start Readiness Program, Head Start, GSRP/Head Start Blend and Developmental Kindergarten, before entering kindergarten.

<u>Parent Dashboard Metric Performance</u>: This metric shows the percent of students who earned proficient or advanced scores in various subjects on the M-STEP, MI-Access, SAT and 8th grade PSAT for a given school, compared with the statewide average, as well as the average percentage at similar schools.

<u>Retained in Grade</u>: Shows the number and percentage of students who were enrolled in the same grade level for two or more consecutive years.

<u>Special Education Enrollment</u>: Provides the number of children receiving special education services from public school districts.

<u>Student Pathways Aggregate for High Schools</u>: Postsecondary data showing enrollment, credit accumulation, remedial coursework, and degree attainment along with select demographic breakdowns for each high school graduating class is packaged in this report.

Curriculum Contact – Designed General Education person who represents the ISD/RESA and is a member of the General Education Leadership Network (GELN).

Accountability Contact – The ISD/RESA superintendent delegates responsibility to this person for complying with FERPA guidelines with the use of MI School Data. This contact accepts the responsibility to create, maintain, and delete ISD/RESA school accountability users, and also collects the FERPA compliance agreements from accountability users of MI School Data.

Technical Contact – Person responsible for creating MI School Data logins and access to approved secured users (once the FERPA compliance is completed). This person also resets passwords for secured users.

Train-the-Trainer Contact – This person has completed the MI School Data training requirements and is a member of the Train-the-Trainer Network. Local school districts and Public School Academies can call upon these individuals to schedule MI School Data professional development trainings that cover over 20 plus courses on "how to" use the portal.
