

Secondary CTE in 2017-2018 Year...


- ★ 110,316 (47.4%) of 11th and 12th grade students were enrolled in a CTE program
- ★ 45,504 (41.2%) students completed a secondary CTE program
- ★ 51,888 (47.0%) of special populations students were enrolled in a CTE program
- ★ 19,188 (42,2%) of special populations students completed a CTE program
- ★ 63 students earned 2018 Breaking Traditions Awards: 4 Excellence Awards, 28 Merit Awards, 33 Recognition Awards
- * 1,951 secondary CTE instructors facilitated learning for Michigan high school students
- ★ 75.6% of CTE graduates surveyed reported that they are using the skills learned in their CTE programs for continuing education or in their current job



Michigan Career and Technical Education 2017-2018






CTE Students Highlights


- Over 95% high school graduation rate

- Students who enrolled in a high school CTE program earned higher wages than non-CTE students within each level of educational attainment
- Concentrators & Completers of CTE programs earned even higher annual wages (about \$5,000 or more)




2018 Secondary Core Performance Indicators: State of Michigan
