### Released to the Public

- The [Parent Dashboard](#), [Our Schools at a Glance](#) and the [Annual Education Report](#) have been updated to reflect school contact information captured in the EEM on April 15.

### Released in Preview

- The [Special Education Data Portraits – Disability, Age Range and Educational Setting and Demographics](#) reports showing different breakouts of students who received special education services have been updated with 2020-21 data. This year's Age Range and Educational Setting and Demographics data will include slight changes to the age ranges. Age 3-5 will now only include students who are not enrolled in kindergarten, and the Age 6-21 group will change to Age 5 (in kindergarten)-21.

### Released to Secure Users

- For users with secure login access, the [Postsecondary Student Data File](#) shows student-level information on college enrollment, coursework, cumulative credit, program and award information, and GPAs for students from in-state and out-of-state colleges and universities. This report has been updated with 2019-20 data.

### Coming Soon

- In partnership with the Office of Educational Supports, the **English Learner Dashboard** will be updated to include four additional metrics. In addition to the assessment and growth data previously included, the dashboard will provide counts of current and exiting English Learner students, a cumulative count of former EL students and the median number of years students receive services.
- COVID-19 continues to affect how districts provide instruction to their students. The [Extended COVID-19 Learning Plan Dashboard](#) will be

updated to include new data collected as of June 16.

- Postsecondary data showing enrollment, credit accumulation, remedial coursework and degree attainment, along with select demographic breakdowns for each high school graduating class are packaged in the [Postsecondary Trends by High School](#) report. School year 2019-20 data will be added.
