### MI School Data User Migration: Action Needed by June 30

Beginning this summer, all MI School Data secure users will need a <u>third</u> <u>party MILogin account</u> with the same email address as their current MI School Data account to access secure data. Users who do not already have this type of MILogin account must create one prior to the migration to retain access to secure data. If this is not done **by June 30**, users will need to fill out a security form and request a new account after the redesigned MI School Data site is launched. Please refer to the <u>MILogin/MI School Data</u> <u>Instructions</u> for information on how to set up your MILogin account now to ensure continued access to your data.

### **Recently Released to the Public**

- The following **Parent Dashboard** metrics have been updated with 2018-19 data:
  - Postsecondary Completion Rate
  - Postsecondary Persistence Rate
- Postsecondary data showing enrollment, credit accumulation, remedial coursework and degree attainment, along with select demographic breakdowns for each high school graduating class are packaged in the <u>Student Pathways Aggregate for High School</u> report. School year 2018-19 data have been added.

### **Recently Released in Preview**

 The <u>Non-Resident Status</u> report has been rereleased with updated 2019-20 data showing school of choice and other resident statuses for traditional and charter districts. This report will be available to the public within a week.

## **Coming Today**

 The <u>Special Education Data Portraits</u> – <u>Disability</u>, <u>Age Range</u> and <u>Educational Setting and Demographics</u> reports showing different breakouts of students who received special education services will be updated today with 2019-20 data. The reports will be in preview for a week before becoming publicly available.

#### **Coming Soon**

- The **Qualified Teaching Staff** metric on the **Parent Dashboard** will be updated with 2019-20 data. This metric shows the percentage of teachers, by content area, who are certified to teach their assignment.
- A new report on MI School Data, the School-Level Expenditure Report, breaks down expenditures of federal, state and local funds for LEA and PSA schools starting with 2018-19 data. Built in collaboration with MDE, this will be the first report on MI School Data to show expenditures at the school level, as required by the Every Student Succeeds Act. Users will be able to compare expenditures at the county, city, ISD, district or school levels with multiple visual comparison tools.
