MI School Data Redesign

CEPI is proud to announce that the redesigned <u>MI School Data</u> website is now publicly available. The new website is designed to connect users to relevant education data quickly and easily, including all the reports you are used to seeing as well as some exciting new features.

Specialized landing pages provide educators, parents, policymakers and members of the media with data of interest to them in one page. Education Focus Areas delve deeper into specific topics, displaying multiple metrics relevant to the topic and narrative to help viewers draw connections between the data, provide context and highlight important information. The Education Map shows information about Michigan educational entities and regions on a map, including fast facts, related locations and peer comparisons. The Compare tool allows users to compare up to 20 schools and districts on a variety of topics.

Users can still access the <u>previous MI School Data website</u> at legacy.mischooldata.org. The previous site will be available for two months after the redesign release.

• The **Student Transfers** metric on the <u>Parent Dashboard</u> has been updated with 2019-20 data.

Recently Released in Preview

• The <u>School Grades</u> report has been updated with 2019-20 data. The report is based on the Michigan School Grades System in which schools receive up to five letter grades and three ranking labels based on various school performance components. Due to the suspension of state assessments in spring 2020, this year's data only include results for Graduation Rates, Chronic Absenteeism, English Learner Progress and Compliance with State and Federal Law for Alternative Education Campuses. Data are in preview and will be publicly available by the end of the week.
