- *Unique identification codes* confidentially track actual student patterns, providing more useful analysis than aggregate counts.
- *Data collections* are combined in powerful ways, connecting students to teachers, courses, programs, and demographic categories; connecting grade to grade and school to school; even connecting early childhood to K-12, college and career.
- *Multiple levels and views* provide statewide, intermediate school district, district, school, and college level information—presented as trend lines, graphs, charts or downloadable spreadsheets—to support meaningful evaluation and decision making.
