## **Renaissance Zones FY2005 Activity**

The Michigan Strategic Fund (MSF) Board designated eleven Tool and Die Recovery Zones. Sixteen applications were received in total. The Legislature amended the Tool and Die Recovery Zone section of the Renaissance Zone Act to enable the MSF Board to combine a number of applications, allowing 92 tool and die companies to receive this designation. Staff also monitored the eight Tool and Die Recovery Zones designated in 2004.

The MSF Board also designated seven Agriculture Renaissance Zones around the state, four of which were for ethanol plants.

Negotiations are currently under way with the City of Greenville to designate their industrial park as a renaissance zone. The negotiations are anticipated to be completed in early 2006.


