

**REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE**  
**Pursuant to P.A. 63 of 2011**  
**Section 913**  
**Assaultive Offender and Sex Offender Programming Report – 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter**

**Section 913:** The department shall submit a quarterly report to the members of the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on corrections, the senate and house fiscal agencies, the state budget director, and the legislative corrections ombudsman detailing enrollment in sex offender programming and assaultive offender programming.

(a) A full accounting of the number of individuals who are required to complete either sex offender programming or assaultive offender programming, but have not yet done so.

*\*The numbers for (a) and (b) include those prisoners who are lifers and represent all security levels. Currently, AOP and SOP are only delivered to prisoners with a Classified True Security Level I or II (including Protective Custody).*

(c) A plan of action for addressing any waiting lists or backlogs for sex offender programming or assaultive offender programming that may exist.

The waiting list for AOP continues to be addressed by placing Level I and II past ERD prisoners with a High COMPAS Violence Risk score in AOP, and Level I and II past ERD prisoners with a Moderate COMPAS Violence Risk into Thinking for Change (T4C) delivered by certified CFA staff. Additional mental health services staff are being trained in the delivery of AOP and SOP, which will increase the number of clinicians delivering these groups. The group size for AOP and SOP was increased to 17 (from 13) to assist in addressing the AOP and SOP program lists. As part of the plan of action, additional violent offender programs are slated to run in early 2012 in addition to AOP.
