## **Michigan:**

Following, are the steps to necessary to view data specific to **Michigan**:

- Go to <a href="http://datacenter.kidscount.org/">http://datacenter.kidscount.org/</a>
- Either enter the state desired in the *Location* section or; click the State of Michigan in the *Choose a State* section.
  - This will take the user to the home page for the Michigan Data.
  - o Note: there are other tabs on this page including *Data by Topic*.
- On the left side of the screen the user may sort for the desired information by several variables, including local Michigan areas (cities, counties, congressional districts), topics and data provider.
  - o The screen will automatically update based upon the information chosen.
- The center screen area will default to show state data.
