Did you Know?

- On average, 682 suspected child abuse or neglect complaints are investigated daily In Michigan.
- In 2017 there were 26,017 confirmed cases of abuse or neglect, representing 37,970 child victims.
- In 2017, 40 percent of victims were under the age of 4.

Children's Trust Fund?

- Is Michigan's only independent, statewide, nonprofit organization dedicated to child abuse and neglect prevention.
- Serves as a voice for Michigan's children and families.
- Promotes health, safety and wellbeing of children.
- Funds local programs and services throughout Michigan to prevent child maltreatment.
- Relies on grants and revenues from direct donations and campaigns to impact the lives of more than 6 million children and families and receives no state general funds.



CTF Leadership

What do our programs do?

Build parental resilience, promotes community and social connections, links families to support in times of need, expands parenting knowledge and supports the emotional well-being of children, by using the Strengthening Families/Protective Factors framework.

Support respite care, home visitation, child development and other targeted services through community-based direct service grants.

Provide funding to educate and support local child abuse and neglect prevention councils throughout the state.

Lead April's Child Abuse Prevention Month campaign, in Michigan.

Champion safe sleep initiatives, the Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) research and other statewide projects.

Collaborate with state partners to build coordinated programs and services.
