


2 MILLION MORE CHILDREN LIVE IN THE SAME HOMES AS THEIR BIOLOGICAL FATHERS TODAY THAN IN 2004.^[1]

“2 MILLION MORE” REPRESENTS A 5 PERCENT DECREASE IN FATHER ABSENCE IN JUST FOUR YEARS.

CHILDREN WHO LIVE IN THE SAME HOME AS BOTH THEIR PARENTS ARE MORE LIKELY TO DO WELL IN SCHOOL, HAVE FEWER EMOTIONAL AND BEHAVIORAL PROBLEMS, AND ARE LESS LIKELY TO LIVE IN POVERTY, USE DRUGS, OR ENGAGE IN DELINQUENT BEHAVIOR.

[1] According to the 2008 Current Population Survey from the U.S. Census Bureau, 49.9 million children live in the same homes as their biological fathers, representing 67.4 percent of all children. In 2004, the number and percentage were 48 million and 65.5 percent respectively.
