7. You received a message from a company you know nothing about, saying you have won a free stereo and bike. To receive your "prize" you have to give them your name, social security number, and credit card number. You should

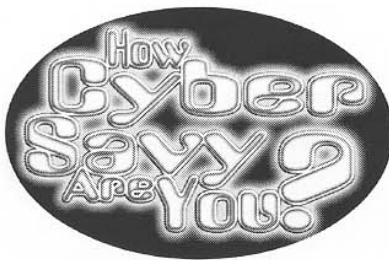
