In 1937, DeWitt Barrels came to Michigan operated by Peter DeWitt Sr., the grandson of the founder. Today the factory is located in Marne, Michigan, where it continues to give high quality service to all its customers. For their hard work and service, they received the "2002 Best Small Business" award by the Michigan Small Business & Technology Development Center, a partner of the U.S. Small Business Association.

Today, DeWitt Barrels is focused on the future looking toward environmentally friendly business practices so that they may continue to lead their industry with their commitment to environmental issues. As a proud member of Michigan's Business Pollution Prevention partnership (MBP3) and the Michigan Clean Corporate Citizen stewardship program (C3), the company prides itself on their continuing efforts to comply with all aspects of today's environmental issues. This year, for the first time, they've emerged as a new leader recognized in the Michigan Environmental Leaders Stewardship program, which requires them to not only meet requirements for MBP3 and C3, but to take their work a step further and reach out to their community.
