**State Implementation Plan (SIP) - This Public Comment ended November 2, 2018.**

The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality's Air Quality Division accepted written comments on the proposed revision to the Michigan State Implementation Plan (SIP) Infrastructure applicable to the 2015 Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). This revision states that the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality has the resources and authorities to implement and complete the requirements set forth in Section 110 of the federal Clean Air Act for this NAAQS.
