DEADLINE FOR ALL OCEANGOING AND NON-OCEANGOING VESSELS OPERATING ON THE GREAT LAKES TO SUBMIT BALLAST WATER REPORTING FORMS. The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) requires all oceangoing and non-oceangoing vessels operating on the Great Lakes to report whether ballast water management practices are being implemented in accordance with Section 3103a of the Michigan Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended. The Ballast Water Reporting form can be found on the Ballast Water Reporting Web site: www.michigan.gov/deqballastwaterprogram. Completed forms can be submitted online via the Ballast Water Reporting Web site above, mailed or faxed to the following address:

Forms should be completed and returned to the DEQ by **March 17, 2017**. A list of complying vessels is required by the statute to be available by April 1, 2017. Any owner or operator not identified on the DEQ Ballast Water Reporting list of complying vessels, or any person in the state having contacts for the transportation of cargo with a vessel operator that is not on the list, will not be eligible for new grants, loans or awards administered by the DEQ after April 1, 2017. REQUEST FOR AMBIENT WATER QUALITY DATA FOR MICHIGAN SURFACE WATERS. The Water Resources Division (WRD) is requesting ambient water quality data (chemical, biological, or physical) that has been obtained by other governmental agencies, nongovernmental organizations, or the public for Michigan surface waters from January 1, 2015, through December 31, 2016. All water quality data submitted to the WRD by April 21, 2017, will be evaluated and potentially used to help prepare Michigan's 2018 Integrated Report. The WRD prepares and submits a biennial report to the United States Environmental Protection Agency to satisfy the listing requirements of Section 303(d) and the reporting requirements of Sections 305(b) and 314 of the Clean Water Act. The Integrated Report describes the status of water quality in Michigan and includes a list of water bodies that are not attaining Michigan Water Quality Standards.
