DTE ELECTRIC COMPANY – TRENTON CHANNEL POWER PLANT, TRENTON, WAYNE COUNTY (SRN B2811), on a proposed draft permit for installation and operation of five natural gas-fired package boilers which will replace four existing coal-fired boilers. Additionally, changes are being proposed to existing permit 125-11B to reflect the shutdown of the coal fired boilers. It has been preliminarily determined that the installation of five natural gas-fired package boilers will not violate any of the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality’s rules nor the National Ambient Air Quality Standards. The facility’s impact will not exceed the available increments for nitrogen oxides, particulate matter less than or equal to 10 microns in size, and particulate matter less than or equal to 2.5 microns in size. Additionally, the new boilers will require revisions to Renewable Operating Permit (ROP) No. 199600204. This public comment period meets the public participation requirements for a future administrative amendment to the ROP. The facility is located at 4695 Jefferson Avenue West, Trenton, Michigan.
