PUBLIC MEETING FOR THE ALLIED PAPER/PORTAGE CREEK/KALAMAZOO RIVER SUPERFUND SITE REGARDING THE PCB CLEANUP NEAR OTSEGO TOWNSHIP DAM, OTSEGO, ALLEGAN COUNTY. A public meeting is being held at 6pm on August 23, 2016 at the Otsego District Public Library, Program Room, 401 Dix St, Otsego, Allegan County concerning the PCB Cleanup near the Otsego Township dam. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency is overseeing the removal of PCB-contaminated sediment and soil along the Kalamazoo River near the Otsego Township Dam. Georgia-Pacific LLC, Weyerhaeuser Co. and International Paper Co. have been required to carry out all cleanup activities. Throughout this project, EPA will be coordinating with Michigan Department of Environmental Quality and Michigan Department of Natural Resources. The cleanup will focus on a 1.7-mile long area of PCB-contaminated sediment and soil immediately upstream of the Otsego Township Dam. This portion of the Kalamazoo River is located in what EPA calls Area 3 of Operable Unit 5 at the Allied Paper Inc./Portage Creek/Kalamazoo River Superfund site. EPA will hold a public meeting to explain the cleanup, which could take two or more years to complete. Additionally EPA will be giving updates on the cleanup progress for the larger Kalamazoo River Superfund site, an update on the Plainwell Mill, and an update on the Allied Paper Landfill Site.
