Written comments are being accepted on a proposed modification of a 6.75 acre conservation easement agreement held by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) that was originally conveyed by Michelle O. Butler and Clark E. Lambros to the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) on May 25, 1994, and recorded June 30, 1994, Liber 141, page 344, County of Marquette, as part of permit conditions associate with DEQ file no. 92-03-0041-P. The proposed modification will remove 4.09 acres (upland and wetland) from the Easement Premises in order to develop the Clark Lambros Beach Park and allow for future development needed to finance park construction and improvements. In exchange, the proposal will preserve 2.66 acres (0.86 acres wetland) of land from the original easement; and add 12.55 acres to the Easement Premises (8.45 acres of wetland preservation, 1.28 acres wetland restoration, 0.59 acre wetland creation, and 2.23 acres upland preservation). The total size of the modified conservation easement proposed is 15.21 acres. In addition, the proposed new conservation easement area and park will be enhanced by the site clean-up of trash and debris, installation of water equalization culverts, removal of invasive species and environmental plantings of native vegetation to enhance the site as well as hiking and bike paths and trails to be used by the public. Other proposed improvements include the relocation of the Hawley Street Drain so that it no longer discharges directly into Lake Superior and instead discharges into a created wetland site. 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DEADLINE FOR PUBLIC COMMENT REGARDING THE DRAFT MULTIPLE DISCHARGER VARIANCE FOR MERCURY. The Water Resource Division is announcing the availability of the draft Multiple Discharger Variance for Mercury (Variance) for comment. Previous versions of the Variance were developed by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), Water Resource Division, in February 2000 with updates in May 2004 and December 2009. These documents established a multiple discharger variance for mercury and outlined an approach for implementing the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) analytical Method 1631 in existing National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits without causing widespread noncompliance with permit limits. The MDEQ is seeking approval from the USEPA for a multiple discharger variance for mercury for Fiscal Years 2015-2019.
