These dates will be formally announced in the DEQ Calendar and on the DEQ's Gelman Sciences, Inc. Website (www.michigan.gov/deqrrd, scroll to What's New and click on Gelman Sciences, Inc.). A fact sheet describing the alternatives considered will be available for review starting July 7, 2004, at the four local information repositories and on the DEQ's Gelman Sciences, Inc. website.
