
ST. JOSEPH RIVER WATERSHED PLANNING PROJECT

November 2002 through June 2005

In the fall of 2002, the Friends of the St. Joe River, a nonprofit established in 1994 by Athens, MI residents Al and Margaret Smith for the purpose of cleaning and restoring the river and its tributaries, were awarded a grant to develop a Watershed Management Plan for the entire St. Joseph River Watershed. This plan would unite stakeholders in both Michigan and Indiana in a concerted effort to address water quality issues and natural resource protection across jurisdictional boundaries. The fundamental objective of the project was to provide the community with a plan that facilitates and guides implementation of desired goals for water quality improvements and protection as well as a venue to communicate, adapt and revise the overall plan as new information is obtained and milestones completed. Another important objective of the project was to create a management plan that met the EPA's new requirements for the quantification for the sources of pollutants and expected reductions in pollutants with the implementation of BMPs.
