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Kalamazoo River-Ceresco Reach Watershed Planning Project

October 1, 2009 to October 30, 2012

The Kalamazoo River-Ceresco Reach watershed encompasses a watershed area of 13,813 acres or approximately 22 square miles in Calhoun County. There are four tributaries in this reach: Crooked Creek, Unnamed Tributary, Pigeon Creek, and the Easterly and Dibble Drain. These tributaries drain land from four townships--Fredonia, Marshall, Emmett and Newton—and are part of the Kalamazoo River watershed. This project identified and prioritized nonpoint source pollutants, assessed land use planning, and made recommendations based on site specific scenarios to enhance water quality. The project resulted in an approved watershed management plan for the Cresco Reach Watershed.


