**Applications:** Number of individuals with disabilities who submitted an application for vocational rehabilitation services.

**Eligibility determined:** Number of applicants for vocational rehabilitation services who MRS determined meet the eligibility requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.

**Services initiated:** Number of individuals with disabilities who have an individualized plan for employment and are receiving services to assist them in preparing for, securing, retaining, or regaining an employment outcome as specified in the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.

**Closed rehabilitated:** Number of MRS customers who obtained and maintained employment for 90 days or more.

**Total open caseload:** Number of MRS customers currently with open cases.

## Child Support Program (For the quarter ending September 30, 2018)

- Child support cases totaled 811,980 at the end of September 2018, which included 845,634 children. Since September 30, 2017, the caseload has decreased by 32,153 cases.
- From October 1, 2017, through September 30, 2018, \$1,174,569,710 was distributed directly to families; \$81,344,138 was distributed to cover medical costs for children; and \$33,630,268 was collected to reimburse federal and state governments for public assistance provided to families.
- Past due support that was distributed from October 1, 2017, through September 30, 2018, totaled \$327,294,985, which is a decrease of \$5,549,321 over the same time period last year.
- From October 1, 2017, through September 30, 2018, total child support distributions in Michigan totaled \$1,320,128,372, which is a decrease of \$20,070,977 over the same time period last year.
