Dear Senator Caswell and Representative Agema:


The enclosed report is provided pursuant to PA 190 of 2010, Section 513 (3), the Department of Human Services (DHS) Fiscal Year 2011 Appropriations Act. This section requires that DHS submit a report by February 1 of each year on the number of children who were placed in out-of-state facilities during the previous fiscal year, the number of Michigan children residing in such facilities at the time of the report, the total cost and average per diem cost of the out-of-state placements to this state, and a list of each such placement arranged by the Michigan county of residence for each child.

The first page of the report provides the number of Michigan children placed in out-of-state facilities during FY2010 and the number of Michigan children in out-of-state facilities at the time of the report. These numbers are broken down by court supervised children and DHS supervised children. Requested financial information is also on the first page. The second page of the report lists all FY2010 DHS supervised out-of-state facility placements arranged by the Michigan county of residence for each child. The remaining pages of the report list all FY2010 court supervised placements arranged by the Michigan county of residence for each child.

For FY2010, the total cost reported reflects the amount paid to all out-of-state facilities. Court placements are funded by the County Child Care Fund (CCCF). The county pays 100% of the cost to the facility then bills the state for 50% of the eligible costs. However, a portion of some of the payments for court placements, as well as DHS placements, may be covered by court ordered parental support money, government benefits or some other type of collection. Therefore, it is not possible to give the exact dollar amount that the state reimburses the county for each of these placement settings. An approximate state cost is provided in the report.
