Dear Senator Caswell and Representative MacGregor:

This report is provided pursuant to PA 200 of 2012, Section 511 (2) of the Department of Human Services (DHS) Fiscal Year 2013 Appropriations Act. This section requires that DHS submit a quarterly report on the number and percentage of children in the foster care and juvenile justice systems who received a physical and mental health/developmental assessment before placement.

Prior to local courts placing youth with DHS under either the neglect or the juvenile justice systems, a youth's legal parent or guardian has responsibility to meet the child's physical and mental health needs. DHS does not have a system to track a child's participation with either medical or mental health systems prior to placement; therefore, DHS is unable to produce pre-placement physical and mental health assessment data.

DHS does however, evaluate the needs of children placed into foster care under the supervision of the department within 30 days of placement. The assessments conducted specifically require evaluation of medical and emotional/mental health issues and that evaluation drives the development and delivery of appropriate services.


Further, as a function of compliance with the modified settlement agreement, DHS evaluates the completion of initial medical and mental health screenings for children entering foster care. Every six months, the Children's Services Administration, Division of Continuous Quality Improvement, evaluates initial medical and mental health screenings through a qualitative case review of a representative sample of children that entered foster care during a defined three-month period. As reported in the April 18, 2013, quarterly report, the case reviews conducted for children who entered foster care between July 1, 2012 and September 30, 2012, indicated that 81.5 percent of children received timely health examinations after entry into foster care. For the same

sample, 84.9 percent of the children entering foster care received a required mental health examination after entry into foster care.

Beginning the week of July 22, 2013, DHS will commence an evaluation of initial medical and mental health screenings completed on children that entered foster care between January 1, 2013 and March 31, 2013. The results of these case reviews will be provided in the fourth quarter report.
