- a) *The number of new applicants who successfully met the requirement of the 21-day assessment period for Partnership. Accountability. Training. Hope. (PATH).*
- b) *The number of new applicants who did not meet the requirement of the 21-day assessment period for Partnership. Accountability. Training. Hope. (PATH).*
- c) *The number of cases sanctioned because of the school truancy policy.*
- d) *The number of cases closed because of the 48-month and 60-month lifetime limits.*
- e) *The number of first-, second-, or third-time sanctions.*
- f) *The number of children ages 0-5 living in FIP sanctioned households.*
