Dear Senator Caswell and Representative Agema:

Section 274 (2) of 2011 Public Act No. 63, Article X, requires the Department of Human Services to prepare an annual report on its efforts to identify additional Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) maintenance of effort opportunities from private sources, local units of government, and other state agencies.

In fiscal year 2011, the Department of Human Services contracted with the Public Consulting Group (PCG) on a contingency fee basis to assist the state in maximizing its MOE opportunities. PCG employed a number of strategies in this effort, including assisting with claims for refundable earned income tax credits, independent private foundation programs, United Ways, eligible TANF programs operated by Wayne County, and food bank programs in Southeast Michigan.

The attached table compares fiscal year 2010 MOE spending to fiscal year 2011 MOE spending.
