
On August 25, 2014, Licensing Consultant Roeiah Epps completed Special Investigation Report #2014A0986018 and cited you for violating licensing rules R 330.1806(2) and R 400.1404(3)(a)(b)(c) due to a resident choking on food during dinner and later dying while in the care of an unknown person. As a result, a recommendation to revoke your license to operate an adult foster care family home was made by the Department of Human Services.

Therefore, it is the Bureau of Children and Adult Licensing's decision to offer you the opportunity to administratively close your license.

Unless you object to this action, the Bureau of Children and Adult Licensing will administratively close your license. If, within 30 days of receipt of this certified letter, you wish to object to the administrative closure you may do so, in writing, to my office at the address listed below. Upon receipt of your written objection, the Bureau of Children and Adult Licensing will proceed with a formal notice of intent to recommend revocation of your license. If you are able to provide new information for our consideration, a further review of your license may occur.
