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**ORDER GRANTING PETITION FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF  
COURT PROCEDURES TO ADJUDICATE LIQUIDATOR'S CLAIMS  
AGAINST JOHN PAP, M.D.**

PRESENT: HONORABLE JAMES S. JAMO, CIRCUIT COURT JUDGE

**WHEREAS**, Patrick M. McPharlin, Director of the Michigan Department of Insurance and Financial Services and duly appointed Liquidator of Consumers Mutual Insurance of Michigan (the “Liquidator”), has filed a Petition for Establishment of Court Procedures to Adjudicate Liquidator’s Claims against John Pap, M.D. (the “Petition”); and

**WHEREAS**, as described in the Petition, there is an unresolved dispute requiring this Court’s review and adjudication that has been raised by the Liquidator regarding refunds of overpayments made to John Pap, M.D. (“Dr. Pap”) and the determinations on those claims made by the Liquidator and his appointed Special Deputy Liquidator James Gerber (the “Special Deputy Liquidator”); and


**WHEREAS**, the Court therefore finds it appropriate for the Court’s orderly, thorough, and fair adjudication of this dispute, as well as in the interest of judicial economy, to set a schedule for Dr. Pap’s response and oral argument and to establish certain other procedures governing the Court’s adjudication of this dispute;

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that the Court GRANTS the Liquidator’s Petition, and the Court will adjudicate the Liquidator’s unresolved claims regarding refunds of overpayments made to Dr. Pap, as described more fully in the Petition and the Exhibits attached thereto.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that the Court’s adjudication of the Liquidator’s claims against Dr. Pap is governed by the following procedures:

- 1) Dr. Pap will file a response to the Petition with the Court and serve his response on the Liquidator's counsel within 30 days of the date of this Order.
- 2) The Court will schedule oral argument to adjudicate the Liquidator's claims against Dr. Pap at an available date and time not earlier than 45 days after Dr. Pap files his response.
- 3) At least 7 days before the oral argument, the Liquidator may file a reply.
